The rice production shortfall in the ongoing fiscal is being attributed to the droughts in most rice growing regions caused by poor rainfall in mid-94 and the resultant shortage

in surface and underground water levels projected 'during the current dry season.

A drop in the aman and boro production would mainly result in the shortfall while aus and wheat output would increase slightly, according to the Agriculture Ministry fig-
