Japan proposes six-point plan to develop aid initiative for APEC

FUKUOKA, Japan, Feb 14: Japan proposed Tuesday a sixpoint plan to develop its aid initiative for the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) forum, urging the private sector and non-government agencies to take part, says AFP.

The plan, presented to senior APEC officials at their first meeting ahead of this year's summit in Osaka, also called on the group's modest secretariat in Singapore to help implement the initiative.

Japanese Foreign Minister Yohei Kono proposed the "partners for progress" idea at the last annual meeting of APEC ministers in Jakarta in November.

At the time. Kono said the Japanese initiative aimed to move away from the traditional "one-sided" approach to development aid — of rich countries helping poorer nations Instead, Japan called for a "network of effective cooperation" among the 18 members by drawing on each one's strengths.

gramme. A diplomat from one APEC country said the Japanese proposal was well received by other members of the group although there were demands for "further clarifications" on some issues.

Among steps for achieving what bureaucrats here are already calling "PFP" programmes, the current APEC ch'airman proposed cooperation within the range of each member's financial, human. natural and administrative re-

"In order to effect this cooperation, mobilisation of such sources as private-sector and non-governmental organisations, as well as ODA (Official Development Assistance Activities), shall be encouraged, it said.

Japan also assured other APEC officials that it's initiative would not need the setting up of an additional organisa-

tion. "The secretariat should bear the role of a clearing house with the primary goal of gathering information relevant to PFP programmes," the Japanese proposals aid.

Under a three-year arrangement ending this year. the Singapore secretariat has 12 professional staff seconded from APEC members. Facilities and support staff are provided by the Singapore government.

Japan said the goal of the initiative was to enhance APEC activities in the area of economic and technical cooperation while at the same time liberalising and facilitating regional trade and investment.

At their second informal summit in Indonesia last November, APEC leaders set regional free trade and investment deadlines of 2010 for industrialised members 2020 for developing members.

Japan, the world's biggest aid donor, said the partners for progress programme would be an "advanced form of cooperation" allowing members with the potential to deal with

common regional issues to show their own initiative.

Under its proposal, the scope of the programme could be extended from existing APEC activities to other areas in the future while its conditions would eventually allow countries from outside the region to take party.

"Although' programmes must basically focus on regional member economies programme with an extended effect on extra-regional countries in the future are also possible," the proposal said.

Three ways of developing concrete projects are envisaged involving cooperation among developing economies themselves, coordination with industrialised economies and an approach combining the

APEC groups Australia. Brunei, Canada, Chile, China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, South Korea, Malaysia, Mexico. New Zealand, the Philippines, Papua New Guinea, Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand and the United States.

"More such agreements are in the pipeline," he added.

India, which opened its power sector to foreign investors in 1993, had offered attractive sops including tax holidays, sovereign guarantees and 16 per cent return on foreign investment, prompting criticism that it was selling

Guaranteed returns for future power projects were scrapped last month.

India needs to increase power generation by some 10,000 megawatts every year to keep pace with growing démands. To do so will require billions of dollars in invest-

ments. Potential foreign investors cite power shortages as one of the major hurdles to set up production bases in India where electricity generation and distribution are erratic.

Enron Power Development Corp of the US is setting up a two projects in Dhabol, some 300 kilometres (185 miles) from the western city of Bombay which will collectively produce 5,088 megawatts.

Bid to explore oil, gas in deep seas

India may invite int'l cos

NEW DELHI, Feb 14: India is considering inviting international oil giants to join hands with its public sector companies in the exploration for oil and natural gas in deep seas. official sources disclosed here yesterday, says Xinhua.

The sources said a plan has already been drawn up by the Indian Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas which envisages majority stake for the foreign company in joint ventures with the oil and natural gas corporation and Oil India Ltd, two largest state-owned enterprises in oil production in the country.

This would be the first time that exploratory deep-sea drilling will be undertaken in India and India is learnt to have selected seven oil giants in the world including Esso Gulf Oil, Texaco, Mobil Cheron, British Petroleum and Shell to carry out the highly technological and capital-intensive activity.

The sources said the Indian state-owned companies' equity participation will be restricted to 26-40 per cent.

Under the plan now chalked out and expected to be announced in about a month, exploration will start in depths ranging between 200 and 300 meters and later it is proposed to go as deep as 1,000 meters.

India hopes that the international oil companies would transfer some technology in the process of joint exploration.

India is also planning to undertake extensive and detailed seismic survey of the sedimentary areas of the country. So far only 25 per cent of the 1.72 million square kilometers of known sedimentary area in the country have been explored for oil and gas, the sources said.


