Regarding the 'distortion of prices' that may arise out of more than one market with the same listings, Amir Khasru said, "We have nothing to do with the prices as we will leave the matter to the market forces."

"We want more professionals to come and get involved in the equity market. The CSE would extend them the opportunity to utilise their talents in this field," he said.

The CSE Chairman also said creation of the new stock market would give Bangladesh a new exposure to the outside world, which might pave the way for further inflow of portfolio investments.

DSE member Hemayet Uddin Ahmed, however, said the location-based stock exchange is losing its ground in the present context, when the traders can purchase or sell shares staying at home by virtue of the screen-based

trading system.

The DSE is also going to introduce the system by the end of this year, Hemayet Uddin said, adding the decision of allowing a second stock exchange at the moment does not reflect the forward-looking attitude of the government.

He said there are instances that the stock exchanges in some countries are being unified to meet the need of the time. In Australia, all the six stock exchanges have unified themselves and in the Philippines, two stock exchanges merged into one, Hemayet Uddin, who is also a former Chairman of the DSE, told

The Daily Star. More than one stock exchange in a country with the same listings would only cause volatility in prices and create a feeling of deprivation among some of the investors," he said.

To implement the decision the South Korean government will enact a special law on the employment of foreign workers within the year.

Seoul's plan is designed to deal with loopholes exposed in the government's foreign labour policy by organisations employing migrant workers. authorised or unauthorised.

The ministry said, however. that the number of work permits to be issued to unskilled foreign workers will be strictly controlled.

South Korea will seek to have "unauthorised' migrant workers replaced gradually by those with work permits after the law is enacted.

During its stay in the capital, the US team met with government officials and labour representatives and discussed general policy on labour standards and trade issues.

The US government concern grew out of the "Child Labour Deterrence Act" Bill introduced in the US Congress by Senator Tom Harkin in 1992, seeking to impose sanctions on those countries exporting goods to the United States using child labour

The Bill has been kept in abevance since then but may be revived again this year.

The United States is by far the largest export market for readymade garments from Bangladesh. Some 60 per cent of the country's 1.5 billion USdollar garment exports go to the United States.

Under the JSAC programme, the composite jute mills are getting a subsidised effective interest rate of only two per cent on their loans zero per cent for the first three years and three per cent for the remaining 12 years. On the other hand, the

spinning mills are getting bank financing at a high interest rate of 12.5 per cent.

The composite mills are taking full advantage of the situation and are even not complying with a protection clause under the JSAC programme which prohibits them from increasing their jute yarn and twin production, the BJSA chairman noted.

"The composite jute mills are ignoring the protection clause provided under the JSAC and are involved in the export of jute yarn and twin. thus creating a unhealthy competition:" he said.

Jute yarn and twin exports by the composite jute mills increased from 10,464 metric tons in 1991-92 to 21,380 metric tons in 1993-94.

"The policy distortion has profound negative impact on the viability of the spinning sector," Yusuf added. "We feel that the industry should be equally treated vis-a-vis the composite jute mills and be given similar restructuring benefits."

He suggested that the interest rate for the jute spinning sector, be lowered to

eight per cent in line with the concessional rate recommended under the 1991 industrial policy, for industries exporting 70 per cent of its production. Some of the financial facili-
