The dollar's weakness followed its overnight trend in New York, where traders focused on Mexico's troubled economy. A poor auction of Mexican treasury bills showed a continued lack of foreign investor confidence in the nation's financial markets.

Australia urges India to lower tariff walls

NEW DELHI. Feb 16: Australia urged India on Wednesday to lower tariff walls to boost trade and called for an expansion of business ties from traditional commodities to newly-opened growth sectors. reports AFP.

Trade Minister Bob McMullan, leading a 150-member business delegation, said Australian companies were keenly eyeing India's telecommunications, power, road-building and services sectors.

McMullan said at the opening of the ninth Australia-India joint business council meeting here that high Indian tariffs were inhibiting trade in such sectors as coal, which he said held the key to expanding trade ties.

We would like to enter into-

a durable partnership in coal as your power sector expands and steel-making continues to grow," he said.

"If we are to maximise the potential of this partnership then we will look to the government of India to reduce tariffs," he said. "But we can do more than supply coal. We can provide technical expertise. equipment and services.

Trade between the two countries reached 961 million US dollars last year. Australia's exports to India were worth 642 million dollars, with coal accounting for more than half the earnings.

India, the third largest market for Australian coal, is Australia's 19th largest trade

Karma-Sahayak Foundation extends credits to 2.17 lakh families

The "Palli Karma-Sahayak Foundation" has so far extended credits to 2.17 lakh families in its efforts towards poverty alleviation.

Since its inception some four and a half years ago, the Foundation designed to extend small loans to the rural poor on easy terms, has identified more than ten lakh families in the country eligible for credits. The Foundation expects that rest of the families would be covered within a reasonable

period of time. The non-profit Foundation has gone a long way in achieving its goal of being helpful to the rural poor within a short span of its functioning, sources in the Foundation told BSS

The Foundation so far has a capital of Taka 45 crore.

The Foundation levies a nominal service charge of 3 to 4.5 per cent on amounts of credits depending on their sizes and are repayable in 36 months, the first six months of which are grace period. The amounts are repaid in ten equal instalments in remaining

So far 2.17.000 families have been given credits by the foundation. "The Foundation is satisfied after repeated on the spot checks that these families have been able to utilise the credits profitably and have made a beginning to come out of the poverty cycle." M A M Ziauddin, Managing Director of the Foundation, said.

The Foundation has not yet accepted any funds or donations from foreign govern ments and agencies. This enables it to explain to the borrowers that the money given to them is Bangladesh's tax payers money and this programme of poverty alleviation is Bangladesh government's own programme

UAE nabs 164 Pak job seekers

ABU DHABI, Feb 16: The United Arab Emirates (UAE) arrested 164 Pakistanis and other Asians who tried to enter the country illegally over the past two weeks, newspapers reported here yesterday. Border and coast guards called in the air force when they carried out raids in the mountains in Diba and towns in the eastern region near the border with Oman, the papers said Coast guard sources said those arrested included Pakistanis Alghans and Iranians. They came by sea seeking jobs in the oil-rich Gulf country, reports AFP.

China raids plants making pirated discs

BELJING. Feb 16: China said on Wednesday officials had raided several plants making pirated compact discs, a key demand of US negotiators pressing Beijing for better intellectual-property' protection. The disclosure by the commu nist party People's Daily coin cided with the start of high stakes Sino-US talks on protection of copyrights and other intellectual property in China Billions of dollars worth of tit for-tat trade sanctions will be imposed on February 26 unless a deal is struck that satisfies US concerns on piracy and media-market access, reports Reuter.

Whaling by Japan protested

WELLINGTON, Feb 16: New Zealand has protested to the Japanese government about whaling in the newly created southern ocean sanctuary, Foreign Minister Don Mckinnon said yesterday. In a statement, he said New Zealand was strongly opposed to scientific whaling and had said so many times. Environmental group Greenpeace said earlier it had filmed a Japanese whal ing fleet hunting minke whales in the newly created sanctuary which includes two-thirds of New Zealand's territorial waters, came into effect in December, reports Reuter.

British inflation rises to 3.3 pc

LONDON, Feb 16: British inflation, on a 12-month basis rose to 3.3 per cent in January from 2.9 per cent in December, but unemployment fell, of ficial figures showed yesterday. Retail prices were unchanged in January but retail sales fell. The inflation figures from the central statistical office showed that if the cost of housing were excluded from the calculation to give a figure comparable to inflation calculations in other countries, prices had fallen by 0.1 per cent, having risen by 0.5 per cent in December, reports AFP:

Nigeria produces 1.815m BPD of oil

LAGOS, Feb 16: Nigeria

produced 1.815 million barrels of crude oil every day in January, 50,000 barrels lower than the OPEC quota allocation of a daily 1.865 million barrels. Tokyo may earmark \$10b for Kobe

TOKYO, Feb 16: The Japanese government is expected to earmark more than trillion yen (10 billion dollars) in a supplementary budget for fiscal 1994 to help rebuild quake-ravaged Kobe and its vicinity, a finance ministry of ficial said today. Finance Minister Masayoshi Takemura is expected to present the aid package at an extraordinary cabinet meeting late Friday and the government is to formally decide on the package on February 24, the official said. The official however refused to disclose details, saying "we are still in the process of compiling the budget," reports




