MYMENSINGH, Feb 17: The government has sanctioned 5.450 metric tons of wheat for implementing 657 development projects in 12 thanas and three municipal ties of the district under food for work programme (FWP) during the current fiscal year, reports

Share transactions were higher in the previous week due to active buying by some foreign investors in view of the decline in some blue chip shares prices, although it started to fall from the beginning of the fasting month of Ramadan, market operators

Market capitalisation of the listed securities started the week Saturday with Tk 39.46 billion after a slight decline from the previous weekend's Tk 39.59 billion. At the close of trading on Thursday it stood at Tk 38.42 billion.

SB lends Tk 7 cr | to 23 industrial projects in 1 yr

Sonali Bank has sanctioned in one year an amount of Taka six crore and 89 lakh as credit for 23 industrial projects under the credit guarantee scheme introduced by the government for financing fresh entrepreneurs, reports BSS.

This has resulted in employment opportunities for about 600' people, a Sonali Bank press release said here vesterday.

The projects enjoying finance under the scheme in volving 11 industrial projects and 12 agro-based industrial units. It may be cited that five of them have already started production.

Among the sanctioned in dustrial units, there are one modern press, three knit garments, four garment embroidery factories. two garment accessories factories, one light engineering workshop, four poultry farms, seven dairy farms and one fishery project.

Farmers' bank likely in Fig.

SUVA. Feb 17: Consultants from the UN Economic and Social Committee for Asia and the Pacific are studying the feasibility of a farmers' bank in this sugar-producing island state, it was announced yesterday, reports AFP.

The three-week study has been commissioned by the Sugar Cane Growers Fund, said Fund Chairman Gerald Barrack

In 1984 this fund took over from the cane price support fund and has about 38 million Fijian dollars (28 million US dollars of growers' money under its control.

The notion of a farmers bank was first mooted in 1992 by the National Farmers Union. a powerful cane-growers' trade union, but it initially failed to get government support.

Cane farmers' indebtedness, believed to exceed 80 million US dollars, has been a

major concern with the union. There are 21,000 registered cane farmers in this Pacific state, largely Indian tenant farmers working fourhectare (10-acre) plots.

Fiji's 1994 crushing season produced 516,589 tonnes of sugar which is expected to bring in revenue of 200 million US dollars.

The two UN consultants are due to submit a report next nonth, Barrack said.

ROK agrees to tap Uzbek gold, other natural resources

SEOUL, Feb 17: Uzbekistan and South Korea agreed Thursday on the joint development of gold and other nat ural resources in the former Soviet Republic, a joint presidential statement said, reports AFP.

The agreement was signed by Uzbek President Islam Karimov and South Korean counterpart Kim Young-Sam at a summit during Karimov's official three-day visit here.

The two leaders also agreed to step up cooperation in trade, investment and other areas with joint efforts focused on agriculture, energy, communications, transport, construction and natural resources development, Kim's office said.

Karimov supported South Korea's bid for a non-permanent seat in the UN Security Council, it said.

For his part, Kim called for Karimov's concern for 200,000 ethnic Koreans in Uzbekistan, promising to aid their economic development and provide consultants and

US agrees to pay Italian bank \$400m to settle Iraqi loans

Iraq defaulted on the loans

WASHINGTON, Feb 17: The US government has agreed to pay 400 million dollars to set tle claims by a major Italian bank whose Atlanta branch funnelled 5.5 billion dollars in loans to Iraq in the years before the Gulf War, the Justice Department announced Thursday, says AP.

The money will be paid to settle the Italian bank's claim for more than 450 million dollars resulting from Iraq's default on US government-guaranteed loans with which Iraq bought a wide variety of American farm products.

in August 1990 after it invaded Kuwait. Banca Nazionale del Lavoro, or BNL, which is owned by the Italian government, and nine other banks that helped finance sales of US farm commodities to Iraq filed claims for reimbursement under the Agriculture Department's export-credit guarantee programme.

Now that guarantee programme: known as the Commodity Credit Corp., will , pay BNL 400 million dollars. Some Democratic lawmak-

ers led by Rep. Henry B. Gonzalez of Texas, have alleged that Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein used at least some of the money obtained under the CCC programme to develop Iraq's military and nuclear arsenals before it invaded Kuwait.

Payment of BNL's claim had been held up for several years by a criminal investigation of its Atlanta branch, which funnelled the 5.5 billion dollars in illegal loans to Iraq, the Justice Department noted in a statement.

Brazil's president proposes opening mining to int'l investors

BRASILIA, Brazil, Feb 17: Brazil's president on Thursday proposed opening mining and other important economic sectors to foreign investors, reports AP.

Six constitutional amendments submitted to Congress by President Fernando Henrique Cardoso would also allow foreigners to invest in petroleum, energy, telecommunications and other key areas.

"They are not timid measures. They have the audacity that the moment demands, Cardoso said in a nationally televised press conference.

The changes must be approved by two-thirds of Congress, Previous attempts to change the 1988 constitution were thwarted by lobbies and nationalistic groups.

Stock analysts, however, said investors had hoped Brazil would simply privatize the government telephone monopoly Telebras and break up the oil monopoly, Petrobras.

But Cardoso brushed off complaints that the proposed changes didn't go far enough. "Those aren't complaints.

Those are interests," he said. The amendments would reduce or abolish privileges for Brazilian companies, allow all companies based in Brazil to compete on equal footing for government contracts, and

open concessions for mining hydroelectric energy and domestic shipping to foreigners. He noted that currently Brazil gets only 10 per cent of foreign investments in mining in Latin America, despite huge
