ASEAN, India to step up trade

NEW DELHI Feb 18 ASEAN and India vesterday decided to step up cooperation and trade, officials said here. reports AFP

Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Secretary General Ajit Singh told Indian Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao during a meeting that ways to boost business ties and technology transfers would have to be explored further, they said.

Singh, who is leading a 40member team from ASEAN member countries, said there were vast possibilities in "banking, investment and tourism." following New Dilhi's 1991 economic reforms which unshackled quasi-socialistic crubs.

Raq told Singh that impediments to trade and capital flows between India and the ASEAN - grouping Brunei, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand - would be ironed

Trade between India and ASEAN increased 13 per cent from 1990 to about 2.5 billion dollars in 1993. India's exports doubled to 1.5 billion dollars and imports from ASEAN declined 32 per cent to 991 million dollars.

India became a sectoral partner of the trading bloc two years ago after putting ASEAN at the centrestage of its post-Cold War diplomatic and economic offensive.

Rubber producers, consumers reach compromise

GENEVA. Feb 18: Delegates to international rubber talks said yesterday they had completed the draft text of a global price pact on the 10th and final day of United Nationssponsored negotiations, reports Reuter.

The 39-nation talks, held under the auspices of the UN's Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), had been successful because both producers and consumers had made concessions, they said.

The draft of the new agreement - reached after three two-week negotiating sessions starting last April provides for a modified rollover of the current pact, which expires at the end of 1995, delegates said.

Negotiators said the agreement, the last remaining global commodity pact with economic provisions between developed and developing countries, had become possible because both sides respected its market orientation.

European Union Chief Negotiator Derek Taylor praised

the positive spirit of the meetings.. "The way it was, negotiated has done a lot to improve producer-consumer relations," he told Reuters. "What we agreed is justifiable both economically and politically".

And amid happy faces all round after the last negotiating session, producer spokesman Rosediana Suharto of Indonesia said: "I'm pleased with the outcome ... everybody made compromises for the sake of progress.

A final text was expected later after details were wrapped up in the last drafting committees. The pact is expected to go into force in 1996, after roughly 75 per cent of governments involved in the talks have approved it.

The talks over the past two weeks ended a standoff that blocked progress at two earlier sessions in April and October last year

world's first social dev summit in March

COPENHAGEN. Feb 18: Denmark, the world's leading aid donor in GNP term, is hosting the world's first social development summit organised by the United Nations bere from March 6 to 12, with more than 130 heads of state and government due to attend, reports AFP.

UN Secretary General Boutros Boutros-Ghali, explaining the choice of venue, noted that Denmark allocated 1.02 per cent of its gross national product, the world's highest GNP percentage of aid, to the poorest countries.

It was a pioneer which could set an example to other rich nations to transfer needed resources from North to South, he said.

Boutros-Ghali said it was not necessary to be an economic or military superpower to play a major international role.

Denmark with its 5.2 million population was a small state which had given proof of a political will to solve world problems and to supply the necessary means, the UN chief

Russian PM in Warsaw to sign trade deals

WARSAW, Feb 18: Russian Prime Minister Viktor Chernomyrdin went to Warsaw yesterday to sign bilateral trade deals with the Polish government including construction of a gas pipeline linking Siberia to western Europe. reports AFP.

His visit prompted about 250 protestors to demonstrate outside parliament and the Russian embassy against Moscow's intervention in the breakaway republic of Chech-

Two protestors pretending to be journalists were removed from outgoing Polish Prime Minister Waldemar Pawlak's press conference on the trade deals after they shouted pro-Chechen slogans and "down with Russian imperialism."

The trade deals due to be

signed included agreements on transport, telecommunications, mutual warning in case of nuclear accidents, and Customs and Fishing Cooperation. Under the most important

accord, about 650 kilometres (400 miles) of pipeline will be built across Poland as part of a planned gas pipeline linking Siberia to the Polish-German border by the 21st century.

Jakarta separates Bulog from food ministry

JAKARTA, Feb 18: Amidst falling production and rising price of rice. Indonesia's main staple, the government has separated the national logistics agency (Bulog) from the Ministry of Food Affairs, reports said here yesterday, according to AFP.

State Secretary Murdiono Thursday appointed Bulog Vice Chairman Beddu Amang to replace Food Affairs. Minister Ibrahim Hasan at the head of the agency, the Jakarta Post

Murdiono was quoted as saying the move would allow the two institutions to concentrate on their respective tasks.

The food ministry is responsible for maintaining adequate supply while Bulog, set up in 1967, acts to stabilize prices, especially of rice, through market interventions.

Denmark to host | Clinton admn upsets oil, gas producers

WASHINGTON, Feb 18: The Clinton administration's decision not to cut back petroleum imports - despite a finding that they are threatening national security - is upsetting domestic oil and natural gas producers, reports AP.

Last year was the first time in US history that more than half the oil used domestically came from foreign sources. Additionally, domestic production hit a 40-year low, and the federal Energy Information Agency predicts that 65 per cent of US energy consumption in 2000 will come from abroad.

President Clinton announced approval Thursday of a Commerce Department finding that oil imports could impair US national security "because they increase US vulnerability to oil supply interruptions.

But on the recommendation of Commerce Secretary Ron Brown, who said import duties could be a drag on the US economy, he rejected tariffs on oil imports. "An import adjustment, such as a tariff on foreign oil, would be a cure worse than the disease." Brown said.

Clinton also bypassed new initiatives to bolster the domestic industry and stimulate domestic production, which producers have been seeking for years.

The president said the administration will continue current policies advocating energy efficiency and increased use of natural gas.

Clinton's statement sparked outrage in the industry, which has lobbied the White House aggressively for tax breaks and regulatory re-


