G-7 leaders urged to make rules against piracy on information

Rare Chinese bank money

BRUSSELS, Feb 26: World business leaders yesterday called on the Group of Seven industrial nations to create global rules to guarantee competition and guard against piracy on the information super highway, reports Reuter.

Executives from some of the world's biggest corporations driving the information revolution blending television, computers and communication networks said government should move faster to ensure fair competition or risk delaying the creation of millions of new jobs worldwide.

Business leaders argued that the highest priority must be given to dismantling trade barriers, agreeing on technical standards to make sure global networks are compatible, and determining what services people really want.

US wins Oman's support to continue ban on Iraq

MUSCAT. Oman, Feb 26: The US ambassador to the United Nations said Saturday that she has won Oman's support for maintaining sanctions on Iraq, reports AP.

Madeleine Albright, who was received by Sultan Qaboos. said her mission was "to make sure that we have a sevencountry blocking coalition so that if there are any attempts to prematurely lift the sanctions, that this will not happen."

Under UN rules, a motion before the Security Council can be approved only if at least nine of the body's 15 member nations vote for it. Also, any of the five permanent members can wield a veto, although such a move often is unpopular with other members.

Oman is one of the nonpermanent members of the Security Council, where the issue of the 4 1/2-year-old sanctions will come up for debate in April.

Some permanent members of the council, such as Russia

and France, have indicated a readiness to push for lifting the embargo, which includes a ban on Iraq's vital oil exports.

They argue that Baghdad has compiled with provisions for recognition of Kuwait's borders and for long-term monitoring of its arms programmes.

But two permanent members, the United States and Britain, are adamant the sanctions remain until Baghdad implements all Gulf War ceasefire demands. These include release of some 600 prisoners Kuwait says are held from the seven-month occupation of Kuwait and an end to repression of the Shi'ite and Kurdish communities.

Omani officials have said recently that maintaining the sanctions on Iraq is a "shame on the Arab world."

Iraq already has denounced the Gulf visit of Albright, and a government newspaper, Al-Iraq, said her trip revealed Washington's "extortionist methods.


