EU leaders defend EMU plan

BRUSSELS, Mar 7: Leading European Union politicians fought for the survival of the bloc's battered plans to create a single currency on Monday. after the crisis devaluations of the Spanish peseta and Portuguese escudo, reports Reuter.

The creation of a single currency is not affected," EU economic Affairs Commissioner Yves-Thibault De Silguy said. "All preparations (for economic and monetary union) must be completed by the end of 1996."

The decision to devalue the peseta by seven per cent and the escudo by 3,5 per cent came after a marathon 11 hour emergency meeting of the EU's monetary committee which had been called by Spain following weeks of incessant pressure on its currency culminating in abortive Bank of Spain support buying on Friday.

It was the fourth devaluation of the peseta and the third of the escudo since September 1992.

Spain's currency woes were triggered by political instability which has raised doubts about its ability to take the steps necessary to get its economy in order on the way to the creation of a single EU currency within the next four

The country pledged to do whatever was necessary to keep its budget deficit below 5.9 per cent of Gross Domestic Product this year and 4.4 per cent in 1996.

Portugal, whose economy is closely linked to that of its neighbour, has also seen its currency suffer.

The strains in the exchange rate mechanism currency (ERM) grid - the vehicle supposed to carry the EU to its single money goal either in 1997 or by 1999 - have been aggravated by the flight of funds from the crisis-hit dollar

China must find new jobs for surplus workers

BEIJING, Mar 7: China must find new jobs for tens of millions of underemployed farmers and workers who face lavoffs from money-losing stateowned industries, two government ministers said Tuesday, reports AP.

In rural areas, China has 100 million surplus workers who do not have enough farm work, and about 30 million of them have traveled to the cities this year looking for jobs. said Minister of Labour Li Boy-

Meanwhile, an estimated 30 million workers are surplus labour at China's stateowned enterprises.

"We will start a re-employment project to fesettle surplus workers released from state-owned enterprises quickly." Li said at a news conference, but offered no de-

While heavy losses continue at some state owned companies, the overall picture improved last year, said Wang Zhongyu, the minister in charge of the State Economic . and Trade Commission.

By the end of 1994. 34.3 per cent of state owned enterprises were losing money. compared with 49.6 per cent in the first quarter of 1994. Wang said.

He listed the reasons for the losses as over-staffing, inability to adapt to the needs of the market, heavy debt and

poor management. "In order to solve the problems of loss making enterprises, when we should mainly rely on depending re-

form," Wang said.

But the ministers an nounced no new plans to speed up the pace of reform. The government still plans to limit reform this year to 100 state owned enterprises in 18 cities that will serve as experimental cases. Wang said.

Some of these companies will be allowed to go bankrupt or to merge with more successful partners.

Bankruptcy has been strictly limited despite the heavy drain of money-losing state owned enterprises. The government wants to improve the social security system and have new jobs ready for laid-off workers to avoid unrest.

The government plans to keep the official urban unemployment rate under 3 per

The assets of bankrupt companies will be used to resettle workers first, and then remaining assets will be used to repay debts. Wang said.

Last year, the central government allocated 2 billion yuan (238 million dollar) to set up service industries to provide jobs for workers dismissed from coal mines.

Long-term plans also call for establishing more township and village enterprises to absorb surplus rural workers. the minister of labour said.

The focus recently has been on controlling the flow of rural workers to the cities. To get jobs, these workers now must have unemployment cards from their home areas and work permits from the cities where they move. Li said.

Rabin faces financial scandal

"TEL AVIV. Israel, Mar 7: Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin. his standing badly shaken by ' Arab attacks and a deadlock in peace talks, now faces a growing scandal over misuse of trade union funds for Labour Party political campaigns, reports AP.

The scandal broke this week with reports that police are investigating officials who allegedly used millions of dollars belonging to the Hsitadrut trade union to fund their political campaigns in recent ye-

Although Rabin himself has not been directly implicated, the affair touches at least one Cabinet minister and as well as other leading figures in the ruling party

Haim Ramon, the head of the Histadrut, told APTV Monday that upon taking over the trade union federation from its former Labour Party bosses months ago he uncovered evidence of systematic wrongdoing and "a lot of corruption."

Political commentator Nahum Barnea termed the affair "a political cluster bomb that could destroy not only the careers of (former Histadrut officials) but also Rabin."

Myanmar contracts foreign cos to expand gas exploration

YANGON, Mar 7: The Yangon junta has contracted three foreign oil firms, including US giant Texaco, to expand gas exploration off the coast of Tenasserim, state-run media reported Tuesday, says AFP.

The agreement, signed Monday, awarded Texaco, Britain's Prime Minister and Japan's Nippon Oil the rights to "block M-10," adjacent to offshore territory which the consortium has already acquired. The new light of Myanmar

The foreign petroleum gr oup, represented Monday by Texaco Regional Director Aptric McGuire, has already struck commercially feasible gas reserves in Myanmar Yedagun field, in the Gulf of Martaban.

The report quoted Myanmar Energy Minister Khin Maung as saying Monday that negotiations were underway to sell gas from Yedagun to Thailand, which agreed last year to by gas from the Yadana field, also in the Martaban Gulf.

The Yadana field is currently being developed by US petroleum company Unocal and total of France.

The new light said today that yet another US petroleum company. Los Angeles-based Arco, had begun negotiating with the Myanmar Oil and Gas Enterprise (MOGE) for an offshore exploration licence.

North Korean apples in South Korea

SEOUL, Mar 7: Despite frozen North-South Korean relations, 1,000 tonnes of apples have arrived in the South Kor rean port of Pusan for use in the apple juice industry, Yonhap news agency said, reports

Pusan port officials said Sunday's shipment, aboard a Belize registered freighter. was the first of a consignment of 7,000 tonnes contracted by Seoul's Paeksan Trading Company, the report said.

Trade between North and South Korea, whose governments are involved in a bitter war of words, normally runs at some 200 million dollars annually but has quickened since the signing of the US North Korean nuclear deal last Octo-

ROK population crosses 44m in '94

SEOUL, Mar 7: South Korea's population surpassed 44 million in 1994, the 25th largest in the world, the Na tional Statistical Office said on February 16, says Yonhap.

The society here is moving fast toward information era with ever rising use of telephones, cellular mobile phones, pagers and computers, according to "South Korea's social indicators in 1994.

The South Korean population increased at an average annual rate 1.0 per cent between 1985 and 1994, and its population density reached 449 per square kilometre, the third densest in the world following Bangladesh (870) and Taiwan (579).

South Korea had 44,453,000 population as of July 1,1994

The average age of the South Koreans rose to 30.9 from 30.2 years in 1992, compared with 38.1 of Japan in 1991, 37.4 of France (1993), 35.4 of the United States (1991), 31.8 of Singapore (1992), 28.8 of China (1990) and 25.9 of India (1991).

Chinese porcelains sale retrieved from Diana fetches \$2 m

AMSTERDAM, Mar 7: The sale here of Chinese porcelains retrieved from the wreck of the British merchant ship Diana, which sank in 1817 off Malaysia, fetched around two million dollars on Monday, the auctioneering firm Christie's announced, says AFP.

At the close of the first day in the auction, only 635 of the 1,319 objects had gone, earning more than the estimated value of the entire collection. 1.88 million dollars.

"Offers came mainly from the Netherlands, Germany. France, Belgium and Britain, said Christie's spokesman Maarten Van Nispen, who added that an exhibition of the treasures staged last month in London, Glasgow and Brussels had stimulated interest.

The Diana which went down in the strait of Malacca was discovered by Dorian Ball. Director of Malaysian Historical Salvors. He managed to retrieve the contents of the vessel in a salvage operation last ing from 1977 to 1980.

Iran signs accord with US oil firm

TEHRAN, Mar 7: Iran has signed an unprecedented 'buyback' accord with the US oil company Conoco to develop two offshore fields in the southern Gulf, the Iranian Oil Ministry said yesterday, reports AFP.

The Oil Ministry statement quoted by IRNA said the agreement was signed Sunday in the Netherlands between the Franian National Oil Company and Conoco. The US company was to put

up "all the necessary investment to develop the two fields of Sirri A and E." it said, describing Conoco simply as a company registered in Hol-

Conoco will be reimbursed by a "buy-back" agreement for the oil and gas produced over five to eight years from the start of production scheduled to begin in two and a half years, the statement said:

The rate of resale will be calculated, "according to market prices." the statement said adding that production for the two fields should reach 120.000 barrels per day (BPD). Conoco competed with the

French company total to win the contract, which has been negotiated over the past three It is the first such "buy-

back" accord since 1979 as Iran has always refused to share oil production with foreign companies. It is also the first such ac-

cord with an US firm concerning oil which is a politically sensitive area, and comes at a time when a group of US senators are campaigning to pass a law banning all economic cooperation with Iran, Iran is hoping to earn some

12.5 billion dollars in oil revenues and about 750 millions dollars in gas sales through the

accord, the statement added. And at least 30 per cent of the work will be sub-contracted to Iranian companies which will benefit from a transfer of technology and training for their staff.

Under the agreement, Conoco will also collect gas produced in the two neighbouring fields Sirri C and D for export to Dubai, in the United Arab Emirates. Sirri E' has reserves esti-

mated at about 435 million barrels while Sirri A has about 50 millions barrels. Current Iranian oil produc-

tion is estimated at about 4.2 million BPD of which 450,000 BPD is offshore production, according to official figures. But international experts believe the true figure is much lower than four million BPD.

Diplomatic ties between Iran and the United States have been severed since after the 1979 Islamic revolution which toppled the pro-west

And Washington has pressured several countries such as Russia and Japan to end cooperation with Iran, in a bid to isolate the country which it accuses of backing international terrorism strongly denied by Tehran.

Although the United States is till presented as "the great satan," it has become one of the country's largest trading partners in the past three years behind Germany and Japan. US oil companies bought

about 24 per cent of Iranian crude production in 1994 for about 3.5 billion dollars, according to the Cyprus-based weekly the Middle-East Economic Survey.


