This year, a total of 67,500 hectares of land was brought under IRRI-boro cultivation scheme in the district. Requirement of Urea fertilizer was estimated at 12,000 metric tons. Local fertilizer dealers placed requisite bank draft with BCIC for supply of 7,500 metric tons of Urea but he said quota is yet to be reached here in the district. "

Besides, the Deputy Commissioner, Gaibandha put forwarded an emergency supply of 5,000 tons of fertilizer from BCIC to meet the existing crisis, however, until today, DC received only 1305 metric tons of urea. On high demand of Urea, the district administration could not distribute the said fertilizer due to over powering and undue interference by middlemen. As a result maximum stock of urea were sold out in the blackmarket at high prices.

Our Corresondent from Chuadanga adds:

vere fertilizer crisis is prevailng throughout Chuadanga district affecting boro cultivation in the district. The government is, however, trying hard to tackle the situation. At present urea is being sold between Taka 295 and 300 per bag while TSP is being sold at between Taka 440 and 450.00 per bag in the local markets. The government rate of

not available in the local markets in sufficient quantity. The government has supplied only 115 metric tons of urea and 640 bags of TSP in four thanas of the district between Feb 22 and March 5 this year.

During the current boro cultivation season the Agriculture Extension Department has fixed a target to bring 15071 hectres of land under boro cultivation in the district. but the cultivation of boro is facing severe setback due to fertilizer crisis.

Though the Agriculture Extension Department is expecting to achieve the cultivation target of boro crop but the farmers of the district are not at all confident saying a very poor yield of boro production is expected in the district.

Fertilizer crisis is one of the main factors hampering the boro production.

The cultivation of boro in the current season in Chuadanga district is near completion. In the meantime. the boro cultivators of the district have urged upon the government to ensure adequate supply of fertilizer throughout Chuadanga district to achieve the target of boro production and save the boro cultivators from getting poor yield.

The government has meanwhile made arrangement to supply fertilizer among the boro cultivators of the district through the respective Thana Nirbahi Officers (TNOs) of four thanas of the district. The fertilizer supplied by the government in the district is insufficient, it is alleged.
