The government provides salaries and benefits unmatched in the private sector. About 90 per cent of oil revenue is spend on salaries for government employees.

The average salary is 300 Kuwaiti dinars (1.050 dollar) a month for a low-level state employee and 3,000 (10,500 dollar) a month for a minister.

A World Bank report issued last year estimated the government had 20 per cent to 40 per cent more people on its payroll than needed. It recommended that the

government diversify the economy, provide retraining and privatize businesses to boost the emirate's sluggish economy. The government already has made plans to privatize telecommunication services and the electric power network.

The 1994-95 budget has a 1.76 billion dinar (6.2 billion dollars) deficit from the combined effects of a lower price for oil, the cost of repairing damage from the Gulf War, repaying 5.5 billion dollars borrowed to repay countries that defended Kuwait during the war, plus about 1 billion dollars to keep foreign defenders in Kuwait this year.

Pakistan committed to IMF programme: Bhutto

KARACHI, Pakistan, Mar 21: Pakistani Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto said her government was committed to an economic reform programme with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) despite its failure to meet some of this year's targets.

"For the government, an agreement with the IMF is very important and we make every effort to stay with it." she told Reuters in a weekend interview.

"As long as we work with the IMF and come up with figures together, they will judge us on our joint efforts because any meeting of largest is a joint success and any slippage in targets is also a joint setback," she said.

An IMF mission arrived in Islamabad last week to assess Pakistan's performance in the fiscal year which ends in June and work out how the government can meet new targets in the 1995/96 fiscal year. An agreement is needed

with the second year of a 1.5 billion dollar three year lending programme.

Canberra may resume sheep export to Riyadh

CANBERRA, Mar 21: Australia said today it would resume live sheep-exports to Saudi Arabia, four-and-a-half years after Saudi authorities rejected a boatload of old and diseased Australian sheep and stopped the trade, reports Reuter.

Primary Industries Minister Bob Collins said Australia's sheep exporters had agreed to a set of strict conditions set by Saudi authorities and a shipment of the animals would leave for Saudi Arabia as early as next month. "I'm pleased to announce

that Australia is to recommence the live sheep trade with Saudi Arabia." Collins told parliament.

Saudi and Australian offi cials had met over recent months and clear understanding now existed of the necessary requirements for the resumption of live sheep exports, he said.

"The Australian industry is confident that it will be able to supply live sheep in full compliance with the tough conditions that have been established," he said.

The black goats were paraded through the frading hall of the exchange on Sunday, a trading day in Muslim Pakistan, before having their throats cut in the parking lot outside, officials said on Mon-

In another development, underwriters to the MS Shoes public issue have decided to seek legal opinion on the developments.

Market circles attributed the biggest-ever default on BSE to the negligence of exchanged administration in monitoring the broker's position and rigging of share prices by the company.


