Hasina at rally in Palash

Peasants won't survive if BNP continues in power

PALASH (Narsingdi), Mar 25: Awami League President Sheikh Hasina today called the government 'killer and corrupt,' and said the people will be forced to oust the regime through ceaseless agitation, reports UNB.

"Peasants and workers will not survive if the BNP continues in power," she told a workers' rally at the Janata Jute Mills school ground at Palash in the afternoon.

Hasina said fertiliser and food crises were created because of what she alleged corruption, nepotism and partisan attitude of the party in power.

But the government came out with rifles and bullets to control the farmers who were agitating on the question of their life and death, she charged. "This government killed them mercilessly."

Referring to various promises of the BNP, Hasina accused the government of not only betraying with the workers of mills and factories, but of taking repressive steps to silence their voice.

She warned the government: "You will not be able to protect you chair by shedding bloods of workers and farmers ... the past autocratic regimes



MW power plant has resumed its production. Power generation at Raojan was suspended last week because of mechanical trouble.

procession and went to the residence of the Controller of Examinations at Fuller Road. Sources said, the angry students damaged windowpanes and pelted stones at the

WASA suggests economy in water consumption

By Staff Correspondent Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (WASA) yesterday regretted the recent water crisis in the capital saying that the shortage was temporary and economical use could help improve the situation. A press release of WASA

said all the deep pumps were in operation under special arrangements to supply water to the citizens of Dhaka during the current dry season. Clarifying its position, the

WASA press release said a number of deep tubewells in the city could not function due to low voltage and load shed-

On Tuesday, 16 pumps remained inoperative for 92 hours resulting in the short supply by about one crore and 38 lakh litres.

Operation of the only water treatment facilities at Chandnighat in Dhaka was also hampered due to low voltage.

The total need of water in Dhaka city is 129 crore litres a day while daily production was only 76 crore, according to the WASA

Japan to issue visa to Dalai Lama on condition

TOKYO. Mar 25: Japan will soon issue a visa to the exiled Tibetan spiritual leader, the Dalai Lama, on condition that he refrain from political activity while in Japan, a news report said Saturday. Kyodo News Service, quoting unidentified government sources, said the Nobel Prize-winning religious leader will be issued a visa as early as Monday, reports AP.

Yeltsin orders destruction of chemical weapons

MOSCOW, Mar 25: President Boris Yeltsin issued decrees Saturday ordering the destruction of chemical weapons stockpiles and naming Pavel Syutkin as chairman of the presidential committee on chemical disarmament. Yeltsin ordered the creation of special facilities for the destruction of the chemical weapon stockpile, estimated by military officials at 40,000 metric tons, reports AP.

In view of this it is resolved that the South Asian Pharmaceutical Conference be held on 31 March-01 April 1995. The members also opined that all of the committees and sub-committees formed for the SAPC should work hard to make the Conference successful."

"The members of the CEC had taken note of an advertisement published in the daily newspapers mentioning about the cancellation of the SAPC. The members found that the information given in the mentioned advertisements were not based on facts. All the members of the CEC had condemned such unwaranted and illegal advertisement intended to damage the image of the Society. The members had urged upon all concerned not to be confused by this baseless advertisement."


