Vietnam's budget deficit poses challenge to economy

HANOI, Vietnam, Mar 28: Vietnam's stubborn budget deficit poses the greatest challenge to the nation's economy. a senior government leader said Tuesday, reports AP.

Tax evasion and inefficient production at state-owned companies have contributed to a shortfall in revenues that threatens, this year's planned spending for economic development, Deputy Premier Phan Van Khai told National Assem bly members gathered in

"This is the most critical problem faced by the government," he told the assembly in an opening speech marking the first of the legislative body's biannual meetings.

The government can't pay

its construction bills from last year, and budget revenues for the first two months of 1995 are less than 10 per cent of the annual amount expected. he said "If revenues generated are

not enough to ensure spending and keep inflation under control, we will be forced to cut down on spending." Prime Minister Vo Van Kiet told reporters after Khai's speech. Inflation, which stood at

18.4 per cent at the end of February, is expected to rise again in March, Khai said. The government had hoped to contain inflation at less than 10 per cent this year.

Neither Kiet nor Khai, two of Vietnam's strongest supporters of tree market, reforms

would disclose the size of the nation's budget deficit. However, a government

economist, speaking on condition of anonymity, estimated the spending gap at less than 700 million dollars Meanwhile, Vietnam's ap-

petite for imported machinery caused its 1994 trade deficit to balloon by more than 50 per cent over what the government had reported earlier. Khai said

. The value of last year's imports totalled 5 billion dollars (500 million dollars) more than what previous trade statistics had revealed. The reason for the discrepancy was that earlier statistics did not include equipment imported by foreign joint ventures. Khai


