AGRA, Mar 30: Awed by an enduring monument to love. Hillary Rodham Clinton explored the shimmering Taj Mahal Thursday and declared wistfully, "I think I'll just stay right here."

"I don't think I want to leave," she said, "This place is just haunting," reports AP.

The 17th century pearlwhite tomb was built by the Mogul Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his wife, Mumtaz Mahal, who died giving birth to their 14th child. Its graceful domes and spires are known around the world and visited by 3 million tourists a year.

Mrs. Clinton's 15-year-old daughter. Chelsea, said the building has always been "the embodiment of the fairy tale palace for me."

"I would see pictures of it and I would dream I was a

princess or whatever, and now that I am here it's spectacular," she said.

After strolling the manicured grounds and marbled pavilions, mother and daughter slipped into purple and brown booties, respectively, and ventured inside to view the inlaid marble tombs encircled by filigreed screens of marble.

"This just takes your breath away," Mrs. Clinton said. "It's gorgeous."

The Clintons' guide. Kuldeep Narain, told them the monument "celebrates the death of a queen. It gives pleasure though it's a place of burial."

Quoting the Indian poet Rabindranath Tagore, Narain called the building. "A teardrop on the cheek of

Conscious Citizens of Bangladesh has planned a peaceful demonstration in the city to drive home the group's message that US toxic fertiliser. Norplant contraceptive and Harkins Bill badly affect the Bangladeshis.

They have planned the campaign a day before the arrival of US First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton in Dhaka on Sunday on a two-day visit.

The demonstration would be staged near the Sonargaon Hotel and the Jatiya Press Club Saturday because of security reasons, organisers said.

Speaking at a press conference at the Press Club vesterday, members of the group welcomed Hillary's visit but said issues like US-exported toxic fertiliser or the Harkins Bill that bar employment of children in the garment factories were important to be

taken note of. Lauding the US First Lady's role as regards human rights. particularly rights of women and children, they sought her direct involvement "so that our people do not suffer any fur-

"We are happy that Mrs Clinton is visiting Bangladesh and we want to take the opportunity to bring to her notice our concern", said a member of the group, Farida Akhter of UBINIG.

She said that the trial of Norplant, a contraceptive implanted in women's forearm, was violation of bio-medical ethics and an example of bad science.

Latifa Akhand, another member of the group said that the Harkins Bill was a protectionist barrier against Bangladeshi export to US.

Phillip Gain, an environmental writer, said that an estimated 2800 tonnes of toxic fertiliser were still in the government stores in Khulna waiting to be shipped back to US.

Other members of the group NGO activist Shamsul Huda, former student leader Shirin Akhter and trade unionist Amirul Huq Amin were also present at the press conference.
