

# Rao suffers another setback

NEW DELHI, Mar 31: Embattled Indian Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao suffered another setback today as a centrist party moved towards a sensational victory in the country's most volatile state. Bihar, reports AFP.

The Janata Dal was expected to storm back to power in the state it had ruled since 1990 until New Delhi sacked its government Tuesday amid controversy and fresh elections, officials said.

The Janata Dal had won five seats and was leading its rivals in 61 out of 159 constituencies where counting of the millions of votes cast in this month's staggered elections continued.
