Japan announces 5-yr programme to deregulate economy

TOKYO, Apr 2: Japan an nounced Friday a sweeping five-year programme to deregulate its economy aimed at opening domestic markets to foreign competition and narrowing price gaps with other countries, reports AFP.

But the move came as a disappointment to some of' Japan's major trading partners - particularly the United States - which had sought a greater opening of the market

A deregulation package. covering 1,091 items in 11 areas such as distribution, housing and land use, transportation, information and telecommunications, will go into effect at the start of fiscal 1995 on Saturday.

We will steadily implement the deregulatory measures. and review them in a positive manner by continuously hearing opinions at home and from abroad". Prime Minister Tomiichi Murayama told reporters.

Deregulation is an assignment that should be tackled continuously.

Among the measures spelled out in the package is a review by fiscal 1999 of the large-scale retail store law. which has been criticised as an obstruction to foreign retailers

India has 90 million women workers

NEW DELHI, Apr 2: Women's strength in the workforce in India is 90 million, including four million in the organised sector, reports PTI.

According to official sources, in terms of participation, rate of unemployment and quality of employment. women do not compare favourable with men, though of course, the annual rate of growth of employment of women, particularly the educated women has been of a higher order than that of men.

Women employed in the organised sector are slightly over four million, constituting marginally more than 15 per cent of the total organised sector employment in the country.

Within the organised sector, public sector accounts for more employment of women than the private sector.

Women's employment is the highest in southern zone and lowest in the north-eastern zone. Large-scale employment of women is seen mainly in the plantation industry (52 per cent of total workers) apart from agriculture, the sources

Access of women to employment compared to men is

lower because of their lower access to education and skill development. It is keeping this in view that vocational training for women is being given high priority by the labour ministry. the sources said.

women's call in the Directorate General of Employment and Training. A National Vocational Training Institute and six Regional Vocational Training Institutes exclusively for women have also been opened.

The government is also providing financial support to non-government organisations to undertake action-oriented projects to promote employment of women, the sources said.

The majority of the total workforce of India, both men and women, is unorganised in nature with 80 per cent living in rural areas, 64 per cent being engaged in agriculture, 85 per cent being self-employed or employed on casual wages and only 15 per cent on regular salaried employment.



CAIRO, Apr 2: More than 15 million people are unemployed in the Arab world and 2.5 million join their ranks every year, the head of the Arab Labour Organization (ALO) said

"The employment situation has not improved despite Arab countries' efforts. Negative signs have appeared in countries that were once distanced from unemployment," Bakr Rasoul told the Arab daily Ash-Sharq Al Awasat

He said that 2.5 million new job seekers are added yearly to 15 million unemployed, representing an aver age unemployment rate for Arab states of 15 per cent.
