BCCI fraud: UK lawyer indicted for concealing evidence

NEW YORK. Apr 8: A British lawyer has been indicted on charges of illegally concealing evidence related to the investigation into the collapse of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International, prosecutors said, reports Reuter.

Manhattan District Attorney Robert Morgenthau said David Sandy, a partner of London law firm Simmons and Simmons, was charged with two felony counts of tampering with a evidence and a misdemeanour count of conspiracy for allegedly trying to keep evidence from a grand jury investigating the conduct of BCCL.

A spokeswoman at Simmons and Simmons in London said on Thursday all its partners, including Sandy, declined comment.

Before BCCI was closed down in July 1991 amid the largest bank swindle in history it had operations in 70 countries, with major centres in London, Abu Dhabi and the Caribbean banking haven of the

Cayman Islands.

The bank has been charged with massive fraud, drugmoney laundering, bribing high officials and illegally acquiring US banks. Losses to depositors and creditors have been estimated at US dollar 10 billion

The felony charges each carry a maximum prison term of up to four years.

Sandy's law firm represented BCCI's majority shareholders, including members of the royal family of the United Arab Emirate of Abu Dhabi and agencies of the Abu Dhabi government. Morgenthau said.

The shareholders have said they were unaware of Sandy's alleged activities. The Washington-based firm of Patton Boggs and Blow has also claimed it was unaware of his activities and alerted authorities when it learned of his al leged misconduct.

Reforms double foreign capital inflows in India

Zee TV founder NEW DELHI, Apr 8: The Indian Government's Planning Commission yesterday said the ongoing economic reforms have doubled foreign capital inflows and helped tide over an immediate balance of payments crisis, says AFP.

> The Commission, which is headed by Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao, also said the sweeping liberalisation programmes last year stemmed capital outflows through the withdrawal of deposits by Indians settled abroad.

> "The country's response to the economic reform programmes has been somewhat mixed, quick and strong in some areas and slow and weak in some areas," the commission said in its 1993-94 annual report without elaboration.

India began dismantling four decades of quasi-socialist shackles from its economy in June 1991 in a bid to open its enormous market to overseas competition and lure foreign capital to rejuvenate its fledgling industry.

India's foreign exchange reserves grew from one billion dollars in 1990 to 20 billion dollars last year, and the government has attributed the growth to its market-opening programmes.

The commission's report said the process last year also led to the lifting of controls from several administered prices, ended a harsh regime of licences and permits in industry and liberalised export and import laws.

"All these were aimed at improving the supply side of the economy and hence shift the long-term growth path of the economy itself," said the commission, which controls the central government's annual planned and non-planned spending.

On the funds inflow front, the Planning Commission said capital inflow during 1993-94 at nine billion dollars was more than double the 4.3 billion dollars received in 1992-

The inflow of foreign investment accounteds for 4. billion dollars in 1993-94. nearly eight times the 585 million dollars of the previous year, the commission said.

5.3 pc GDP growth in '94-95 likely

Another report says: India is likely to post gross domestic product (GDP) growth of 5.3 per cent in fiscal / 1994-95, spurred by a better industrial climate, a government report said vesterday.

"The industrial climate is buoyant and private foreign investment has picked up," the finance ministry said in its annual report for the financial year which ended March 31.

The report said the 1991 policy of liberalisation had at tracted rapid foreign capital inflows, taken foreign exchange reserves to a peak of some 20 billion dollars and boosted India's image abroad.

ILO drops plans linking trade sanctions, workers' rights

GENEVA, Apr 8: The gov erning body of the International Labour Organisation dropped plans linking trade sanctions and workers' rights after members from the industrialised countries and the developing world could not agree on the controversial issue, the ILO said yesterday,

reports Reuter. The United States and France have waged a campaign to tie international trade privileges with social standards that bar the exploitation of child and slave labour.

 But developing countries have denounced the Western push as protectionist, aimed at negating their current trade advantage from cheaper labour

"There was a general consensus in the working party that it should not pursue the question of trade sanctions," an ILO spokesman said. "That doesn't mean that parties who initially advocated such an aphave changed their proach

\$ 99 m WB loan to Russia for oil spill clean-up

WASHINGTON, Apr 8: The World Bank announced Friday a loan of 99 million dollars for emergency clean-up work at one of the world's largest oil spills in a Russian republic near the Arctic Circle, reports

The spill occurred last autumn in the Kemi Republic about 1,000 miles (1,600 km) northeast of Moscow. Temporary dams and dikes failed, and pipeline oil leakage they were built to contain gushed into the wilderness to cause "significant environmental damage and risks to human health," the World Bank said.

World Bank environmental official Jonathan Brown said the loan is to finance a project "designed to reduce the extent of the looming environmental disaster."

The announcement said more than 730,000 barrels, or 100,000 tons, of oil remain trapped in bogs and creek beds and could be released into downstream rivers and into the Barents Sea as the spring thaw raises water levels The amount is three times as much as was released during the Exxon Valez oil spill in Alaskan waters.

Normally, the spring thaw begins in early May. The World Bank said new containment structures must be guilt and existing structures reinforced before then.


