Their forte lies more in ex-officio deputations, strictly on ad-hoc

Interestingly, with chess being such a high priority game in the country which has given Bangladesh its sole internationally rated star in Grandmaster Niaz Murshed, is totally unrepresented in the workshop.

One of the aims of the academic exercise, being planned on a grand scale, is to find ways to "democratise" the sporting arena, which has over the years suffered in a most stifling environment due to the ad hocism in administration under ex-officio managers whose jobs or designations counted for much more than their sporting knowledge or disposition.

According to observers, many dedicated and knowledgeable sports organisers around the country have been rudely overlooked by the organisers of the so-called national workshop.
