the 45-over-a-side match. Masudur Rahman, who led the Satkhira charge with the





Some 7.000 jubilant Indian expatriates, who had seen their team-lose 13 of their last 16 matches against arch-rivals Pakistan here, erupted when Azharuddin struck the winning boundary off pacer Champaka Ramanavake.

The Indian captain dedicated the win to Wadekar, who earlier in the day said he would not seek an extension as cricket manager when his three-year term expires this


