

Wyatt passes away

LONDON, Apr 21: Bob Wy att, one of the last surviving members of the England squad that played in the controversial Bodyline series in Australia in 1932-33 has died aged 93, reports Reuter.

Wyatt appeared in 40 Tests from 1927-37 - 16 of them as captain - scoring 1839 runs at an average of 31.70. He also took 18 wickets.

He made his first-class debut for Warwickshire in 1923 and captained the county from 1930-1937 In 1946 he moved to

Worcestershire and became captain there for two years until his retirement in 1951. Though he often opened the batting. Wyatt will probably

be best remembered as a solid and dependable middle-order right-hander. He also bowled useful medium-pace swing. In his first-class career he scored 39,404 runs at an aver-

age of 40.04, including 85 centuries, and took over 900 wickets. He leaves a widow, Molly,

80, who said: "He had tremendous fighting qualities, which he showed in his life as well as on the pitch, he was an indomitable man.
