Shubhra Dev's programme on BBC radio

BBC World Service's Bengali radio will broadcast an interview of popular singer Shubhra Dev in its third transmission starting at 10:30 pm today, reports UNB.
The programme on Shubhra Dev will feature in the programme called "Robbarr Ashor", says a BBC press release.
It can be heard on short wave on 31 and 41 metre bands 9605 KHz and 7440 and 7105 KHz respectively. It can also be heard on FM band 100 MHz.
BBC Bengali service will also broadcast some facts on films from the Guinness Book of Record at its second transmission at 7:30 pm to Tuesday.
These will be in the youth programme called "Rang Mashal".
This transmission can be heard on short wave on 25 and 31 metre bands 11920, 9860 and 9605 KHz respectively.

'Lack of women's role impediment to progress'

World Bank, United Nations and other international agencies feel that the role of women in the society is hardly visible. This insignificant involvement of the half of the population is the main impediment to progress and equality.
This was said by Dr Hameeda Hossain, executive committee member of 'Ain O Salish Kendra' at the Mustafizur Rahman Khan and Saleha Khanam Trust Fund Lecture, '94, organised by the Asiatic Society of Bangladesh last Friday.
Dr Hossain observed that equality for women was impossible within the existing economic, political and cultural processes that reserved resources, power and control for small sections of people.
She added that in Bangladesh the women's movement had moved for specific reforms in the eighties. This brought them the antidote to the cruelty to women ordinance and even set up family courts.
She alleged that these laws proved to be inadequate, and incomplete in the context of complex forms of oppressions to which women were subjected.
FEJB's annual general meet held
The annual general meeting of the Forum of Environmental Journalists of Bangladesh (FEJB) was held at the Jatiya Press Club yesterday, reports UNB.
FEJB Chairman Chinmoy Mutsuddi presided over the meeting while General Secretary Quamrul Islam Chowdhury and Treasurer Mofizur Rahman placed their annual reports.

Stranded Pakistanis on token hunger strike

Leaders of the stranded Pakistanis have decided to hold a token hunger strike at the National Press Club for eight hours on two consecutive days beginning today.
In a press release the general secretary of the Stranded Pakistanis General Repatriation Committee (SPGRC) said that the token hunger strike has been arranged to draw the attention of the Prime Minister and her entourage so that issue of repatriation is raised during her ensuing visit to Pakistan.
The leaders also stressed that steps should be taken to implement the joint declaration made in 1992.
A positive date should be announced to execute the repatriation of first phase of 3,000 families as envisaged in the said declaration.

BDR to intensify crack down on crimes

The Director General of Bangladesh Rifles Major General Ejaz Ahmed Chowdhury yesterday called for eliminating smuggling and other cross-border crimes.
At a meeting of Sector Commanders at Palkhona headquarters, the BDR chief said smuggling was crippling the economy of the country and it has to be curbed.
He also called for intensifying the BDR's on-going campaign against dacoity, push-in, child and women trafficking.
BDR's Deputy Director General Brig Syed Abdur Rab, directors and staff officers of the headquarters were present at the meeting.

17 wildlife species extinct from Bangladesh

Seventeen species of wildlife had already been extinct from Bangladesh and 136 others are in the endangered list, reports BSS.
This was informed at a five-day training workshop on "CITES implementation in Bangladesh" held at the auditorium of Bana Bhaban at Mahakhali in the city yesterday.
CITES is an international convention whose aim is to prevent international trade from threatening the survival of wild fauna and flora. Bangladesh is a member of CITES.
Jointly sponsored by the Department of Forest and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service the objective of this workshop is to apprise the participants of the rules, procedures and technical aspects of CITES for its proper implementation in Bangladesh.
Twenty-six field officers from customs, police, Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) and NGOs are taking part in the workshop.
Inaugurated by additional secretary in-charge of the Ministry of Environment and Forest Svend Amir-ul-Mulk the inaugural session was also addressed by deputy conservator of forest Syed Salamati Ali, conservators of forest M A Sattar and A H M Monzurul Karim and representative of US Fish and Wildlife Service John Brooks. Chief Conservator of Forest (CCF) Dr Shamsur Rahman presided.
Syed Amir-ul-Mulk said the workshop will be useful in preserving bio-diversity in the country.
He said renewed efforts are being made all over the world for conservation of wildlife and its economic use and Bangladesh, being a member of CITES, could not lag behind.
CCF Rahman said the workshop would be useful in identifying the endangered wildlife species of Bangladesh and conserving them by restricting unlawful trade on wildlife.
Pointing to the need for proper identification of wildlife to prevent their reckless catching and export Rahman said necessary technical knowledge and equipment are necessary.

India for SAPTA's early implementation

C M Shafi Sami presented his credentials as the Bangladesh high commissioner to Indian President Dr Shankar Dayal Sharma at the Rashtrapati Bhaban on Friday, reports BSS.
While accepting the credentials, Dr Sharma said India "accords priority to the improvement and consolidation of relations with its neighbour specially with Bangladesh."
President Sharma said in the context of the SAARC, Indo-Bangladesh interaction has been exemplary and called for early implementation of concrete programmes of cooperation such as the SAPTA.
He said Bangladesh and India were linked by very special bonds of shared sacrifices in the struggle for the liberation of Bangladesh. He added that the shared problems of development and scarcity of resources demanded a cohesive and cooperative approach in our bilateral interactions.
He also underlined that the growing trade with Bangladesh and India was an encouraging base on which the ties between the two countries could be built further.

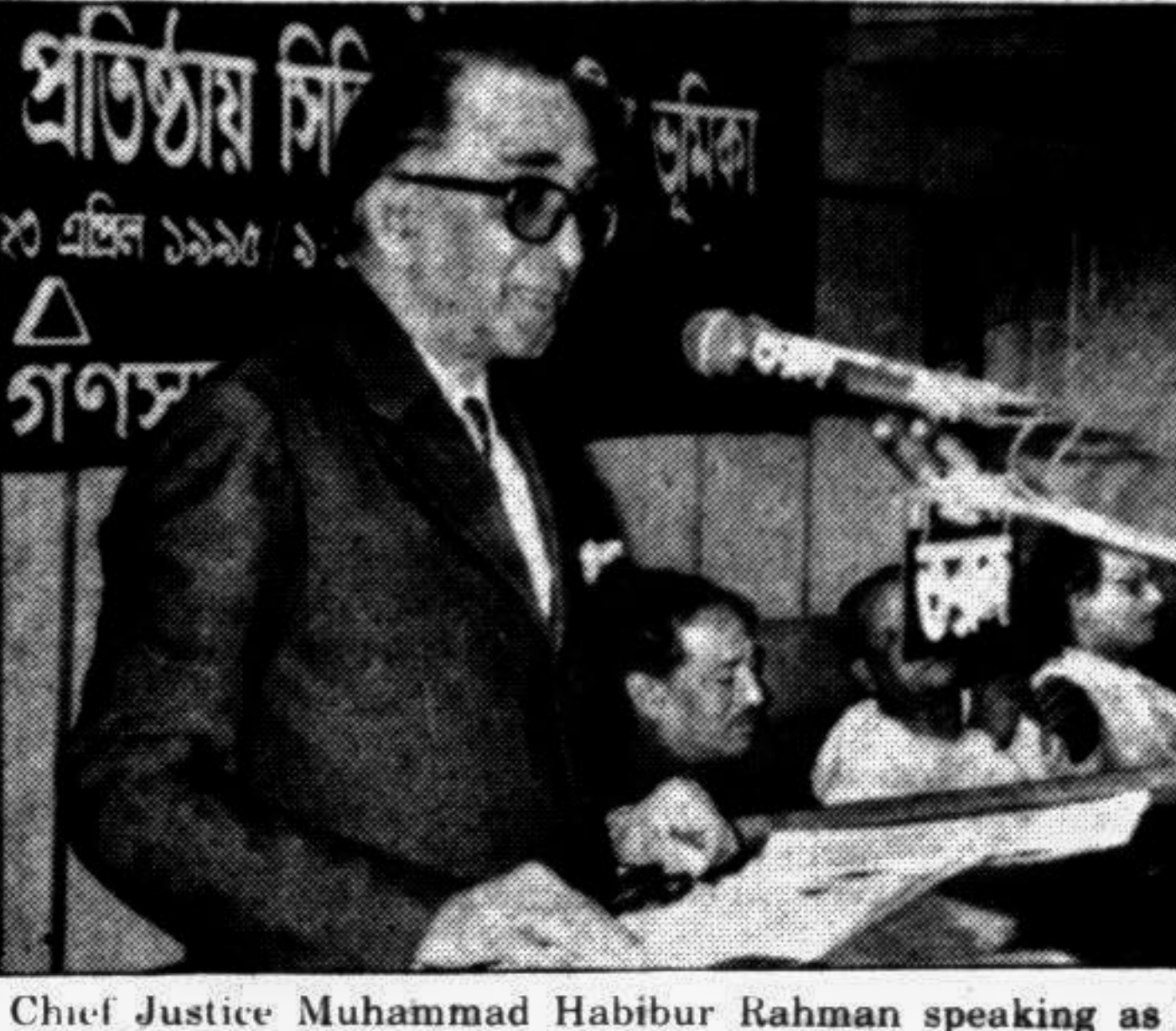
GSS seminar opens

A two-day seminar on "The Role of Civil Society in Establishing the Rule of Law" organised by Gono Shahaajjo Sangstha (GSS) began in the city yesterday at the Planning and Development Academy, reports BSS.
Chief Justice Muhammad Habibur Rahman attended the function as the chief guest and inaugurated the seminar.
Chief Whip Khondkar Dewar Hossain attended the function as special guest.
Chaired by Attorney General Aminul Haq, the function was also addressed by Dr F R Mahmood Hasan, executive director of GSS and Shaikh Abul Hasan, president, central committee of district lawyers' cells.

Justice Habibur Rahman said that establishment rule of law was a popular slogan. He said even the autocratic ruler wanted to establish rule of law.
He said we have to ponder why law cannot be applied in some cases. The chief justice regretted that rule of law cannot be established where terrorism exists.
The chief whip said the lawyers could play an important role from their respective positions in establishing rule of law in society. He called for giving democracy an institutional shape and realising the dreams of independence.

Develop Buddhist sites into tourist spots: Arvind

The visiting Indian Buddhist scholar and chairman of Buddhist Monuments Development Council Dr Arvind Alok yesterday expressed his satisfaction with the rich and beautiful cultural heritage of Bangladesh.
"I am happy to see the government here is preserving cultural heritage and particularly taking care of the Buddhist sites," he said in an exclusive interview with BSS.
His visit to Bangladesh has taken place at the last leg of his tour to Buddhist countries including Nepal, Bhutan, Thailand, Cambodia, Myanmar and Sri Lanka to see various Buddhist sites and monuments.
During his stay here, Dr Arvind visited Mainamati historical sites, Ramu, Cox's Bazar and Chittagong. He will leave Dhaka for New Delhi on Monday.
Referring to the Buddhist sites in Bangladesh, Dr Arvind said that if these sites were exposed and excavated, the country would have the pride of becoming the first country to be known to the world as a potential home of rich cultural heritage.
"If these sites are developed into tourist spots, Bangladesh will attract good number of Buddhists as tourists from other countries and earn valuable foreign currencies," he also observed.
Commenting on the people he came across during his stay here, Dr Arvind said the people of Bangladesh were very cultured. "If their intellectual excellence is utilised properly, Bangladesh will be able to play a very vital role in promoting culture in the region," he said.
Dr Arvind Alok gave a lecture on past and present perspective of Sanskrit and Pali literature in Dhaka University yesterday. DU's Sanskrit and Pali Department organised the lecture with its chairman Dr Dilip Bhattacharya in the chair.
It was also addressed by Prof. Paresh Chandra Mandal, Prof. Narayan Bishwas, Prof. Sumangal Barua, Prof. Niranjan Adhikari and Dr Sukomal Barua and others.
A devout Buddhist philosopher dedicated to world peace through Lord Buddha's teachings, Dr Arvind Alok is also an archaeologist and a renowned author.
He has been associated with the activities of preservation, conservation and promotion of Buddhist monuments, art and culture for a long time.
He has presented articles and research papers both at national and international levels on Buddhist literature, art and culture. He has six books to his credit. He is also the editor of some journals.
He got several awards from the government and non-government agencies for his contribution towards peace and development of Buddhist monuments and Buddhist values.
