TOKYO, Apr 24: Police arrested a senior chemist of Japan's Aum Supreme Truth cult today following the overnight murder of its science chief, which could hamper the investigation into the Tokyo subway nerve-gas at tack. Hideo Murai died in hospital early today from excessive bleeding after being stabbed in the abdomen by self-avowed right-winger on Sunday night before television cameras outside Aum's Tokyo head office, reports AFP.

Indian troops **kill 36** Kashmiris

RAISABAD, India, Apr 24: In the biggest operation in more than a year, Indian troops killed at least 36 suspected guerillas who allegedly crossed into Kashmir after receiving arms training a neighbouring Pakistan, officials said today

reports AP. Policemen said they have found 36 bodies in Chatoosa Nowgam and other villages in the area near the disputed India-Pakistan border, about 80 kilometres (50 miles) north of Srinagar

The toll could be higher because the troops were stil fighting with militants today in the area of about 20 villages, a Defence Ministry spokesman said on condition of anonymity

Ten people, including two soldiers, were killed in separate clashes between separatist rebels and the military in Shopian and Uri towns since Sunday night, the spokesman

In the border area, troops were blocking all roads and preventing residents from ntering or leaving their villages.

Villagers said the army often conducts such search operations, but rarely in such a huge area of the Jammu-Kashmir state.

THE HAGUE, Apr 24: Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic and Bosnian Serb Military Commander General Ratko Mladic could be charged with war crimes in Bosnia-Herzegovina, a UN war crimes tribunal spokesman said today.

Christian Chartier, spokesman for the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia, confirmed to AFP that the two men were under suspicion but added that they had not been officially charged.

Crime among govt officials on rise

Crime and indiscipline among government officials are on the rise, according to a Public Service Commission (PSC) report.

The report, released yesterday, said that the Commission had received 63 and 49 complaints of violation of rules and crime during 1991 and 1992 respectively, and the number has shot up in the following years.

PSC received 114 and 162 allegations from various government departments. The PSC, in its report of

1994, also said that rules were not followed in investigating departmental cases. Long delay in probing into charges often resulted denial of justice to the accused, it noted.
