Triathlon is a race like any other walkathon. cycle race marathon etc. In this competition all you have to do is mix a bit of walking, swimming, cycling in the race; to be precise all you have to do is swim in the open sea for 1.5 km and almost immediately cycle for 40 km which is instantly followed by another 10 km run. Wooh! No problem, provided you have super genes and belong to the elite sportsmen club. Now John Chang who claims to belong to neither of the mentioned category has participated in three such competitions and is, at the moment preparing for the forth one.

Super genes or not Chang certainly has super dedication and commitment. A Malaysian banker, who is on an international transfer

here in Dhaka. Chang is most cer tainly the different one. At the age of 35 when most of his banks colleagues have given up on their Mr Universe shape and have grown soft corners all over their body. Chang is adamant that he will live young and be fit till time permits.

"While in Kuala Lumpur I used to cvcle to work. Moreo veril was always into sports since my school days. In work we had shower facilities and by the time I sat behind my desk I was fresh and clean," he explains adding that while in Dhaka he gave upon all sorts of exercises and work-outs "Since I love to eat was gaining weight and as a conse quence 1 downhill as far as my health chart was concerned," he says

After almost a two-year break from

cycling - his main exercise or sports activity he started to cycle again only three months ago. "I lost 12 pounds during this time without cutting on food. Cycles are the most efficient machine man ever invented. Once you get into the rhythm of cycling it is the most easy task. provided you have the right type of cycle," he explains. "Buying a cycle is like buying a new shirt,

you look for something comfortable, something that suits your size and taste. No matter how efficient a cyclist you are, if you don't have the correct size you'll be uncomfortable", he re-

they work under tremendous pressure. But for

Chang things are not so. "I make it a point that I work like mad for five and a half days and play like mad for one and a half day."

"The most difficult step is to step out of the door again once you step in after work. The first five minutes is killing but you must realize that the entire day you work under pressure. You are stressed and if you don't work that out. it will accumulate in your arteries and then old age would surely catch up," Chang talks about his reasons to stay fit.

For his next triathlon race in June to be held in the States he is training hard. Every morning at 6 am he cycles to Tongi and back. after work, ground 7.30 pm he walks 8km around Gulshan and as for swimming he lifts

weights during weekends.

Bicycling is easy on the joints, the weight is scattered throughout the body. Chang cycles to Comilla every other Friday and this takes him only 2 hours 15 minutes. Only 15minute extra time compared to a car drive. He says that the terrain is flat here in Bangladesh and it is good for the sport. "Cycling is also sort of a mental relaxation for me. Whenever I am stuck with a bank problem or is in great need of new creative ideas, I cycle to relax my body and mind and al most magically I find solutions to my problems.

Besides sports, Chang is also in photography and music. "I have my own band called "Blind Faith and we perform charity concerts and whatever we get goes to charity."

Chang on the move. A dedicated banker as well, he believes that a banker's philosophy should be simple and obvious. He should have knowledgeable power to make decision, "it is the service that is important, not any products that the bank offers Bankers should always better prepared and al ways be should be able to satisfy clients' needs."






## One crore hypertension BR to sell Eid advance tickets
