The newly appointed Chief Election Commissioner (CEC). Justice A K M Sadeque. has expressed his determination to ensure an "unprecedented" free and fair election.

"I know, the next general elections would be very tough. But I will make sure the polls are free, fair and impartial," Justice Sadeque said in an exclusive interview with The Daily Star yesterday.

"I have no compulsion to satisfy any quarter since I cannot be terminated by anybody, except a supreme judicial council," before the completion of my five-year tenure.

In accordance with the Constitution, no body can also re-appoint me to any post of the state. So, why shall I not be neutral since my job is doubly guaranteed," the 65-year old former Judge said. Justice Sadeque retired as a Judge of the High Court Division in January this year.

"The election rules would be enforced strictly to ensure free and fair elections," he said. "And I shall also propose more rules for the sake of impartial and peaceful elections. The CEC further said, "I shall also try to keep elections

free from the influence of arms and black money." Asked whether it is possible for the Election Commission to hold free and fair polls with
