# Kamal opens population workshop

A two-day workshop on "Research priorities in health and population" was inaugurated by Health and Family Welfare Minister Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf in the city yesterday, reports BSS.

Speaking on the occasion Kamal expressed the hope that the workshop would help identify priority research areas and topics.

Chaired by Syed Ahmed, Secretary, Health and Family Welfare, the function was also addressed by Deputy Minister for Health and Family Welfare Mohammad Sirajul Hoque, Director General of the National Institute of Population Research and Training (NIPORT) A K M Rafiquzzaman and team leader of GTZ, a German voluntary organisation, Dr Heide Ricter.

The workshop is being organised jointly by NIPORT. GTZ and the population council. The purpose of the workshop is to prioritise research areas and identify topics of research particularly in the field of maternal and child health and family planning (MCH-FP) up to the year 2005.

The minister appreciated the efforts of NIPORT in organising the workshop and said "Involving all the leading research organisations in identifying research priorities will help not only to avoid duplication, but also to support further development in research with the existing facilities in the country."

Kamal said that Bangladesh had undergone far-reaching changes in the past two decades. Significant progress in many fields has been made through national and international efforts, he said, adding "but still the country is facing serious Economic problems."

An, estimated 3.3 million children under the age of five die of diarrhoea every year in the developing nations. Most of these deaths result from a lack of knowledge about a simple and inexpensive oral, rehydration treatment, says a press release.

A US \$ 75,000 grant from the American Express Foundation is being used to fund an ICDDR,B workshop to train nurses to teach health care workers the use of Oral Rehydration.
