

Bearish run at DSE continues

Share prices of a number issues in the Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE) have been showing a downward trend in the recent weeks, while many issues were being traded below their face value, according to DSE data.

Meanwhile, the All Share price index fell by 9.95 points vesterday and stood at 745.07. A total of 68 issues was traded on the day with 16 gainers and 44 losers while eight remained inchanged.

Prices of the shares and debentures of Beximco group, Singer and some other companies have drastically fallen in the recent weeks as the schedules for holding Annual General Meetings (AGM) of these companies are drawing near, market operators said.

The prices are also falling due to various reasons including large scale sales by foreign investors, political uncertainty
