us. But in the recent past, it seemed that a revolution had taken place in Dhaka citizens' attitude towards flowers. A new outlook is evidenced by the widespread interest shown by them so much so that such interest seems to have become institutionalised. On the occasions of marriage, birth anniversaries or any big functions, presentation of flowers has become an established practice.

There are several areas in the city which bear witness to our new interest in flowers. More conspicuous among them is the Shahbagh area. This area is regarded as the hub of the city's flower market where business worth thousands of taka is conducted.

It is understood that sales of flowers as per orders of customers are more profitable than the retail type. And such sales on orders are said to be very considerable. For the paraphernalia of wedding arrangements, such as decoration of the bridegroom's car, flower ornaments for the bride and decoration of the unptial chamber. flowers are needed. For such purposes, transactions in the flower market are greater in volume.

Previously the space in front of the High Court mazar was the venue of the flower market. Now it has spread to other specific areas of the city. A little distance away from Shahbagh lies the Katabon area where the flower shops outnumber the number of flower shops in the Shahbagh area. The neighbourhood around the Mahila Samity theatre venue is embellished by the presence of some flower shops. Besides these flowers are sold from the Botanical and BDR gardens. It is estimated that sixty to seventy flower shops have come up all over the city. Besides numerous roadside vendors. In short, wherever you may be in the city, you can conveniently buy a stick of tuberose (Rajanigondha) at Taka two.

Lately this wide appreciation of flowers forms a new staple of business in the hands of some nondescript voungsters. They can be seen just at the moment shoppers go to board

By and large, love for flowers is ingrained in . Their cars at the end of their shopping or when the rickshaws we travel in get stalled at road junctions in a traffic jam or in busy shopping areas. Those youngsters offer small garlands at whatever price a customer chooses to pay. This is a sublimated form of begging being resorted to by an increasing number of poor boys and girls. They present a poignant spectacle of a grim battle for subsistence at all weathers, fair or loul.

> In Western countries there is a system called Interflora system under which one can send flowers not only from one neighbourhood, to another but also from one city to another. Suppose someone in London wants to send flowers to his beloved in Manchester on the occasion of her birthday. All he needs to do in this case is to place his order with a flower shop in Interflower network with his payment on account of the price of the flowers and fax charges. The London flower shop will intimate the shop in the same network in Manchester the details of address, date and the kind of flowers required to be delivered in Manchester. Such a system is yet to be introduced in our country.

> For the Dhaka flower markets, supplies mainly come from the Jessore area. Some places in Savar also produce flowers. There is also some smuggling of flowers from across the borders. According to our Export Promotion Bureau, there are bright prospects for earning substantial foreign exchange through exports of flowers after meeting the internal needs. At present the turnover in the global flower market is reportedly valued at 160 billion dollar. Holland enjoys the foremost position in the global market for the commodity with a share of 67 per cent of the trade. Italy. Colombia. India. Kenya and Israel are also engaged in this foreign trade. For Bangladesh there are immense possibilities of playing an important part in this field if cultivation of flowers of different varieties is boosted through special measures and on scientific lines in suitable areas of the country.






