The US embassy yesterday welcomed the decision of the Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters' Association (BGMEA) to start fresh discussions with all sides concerned to draft a revised memorandum of understanding (MOU) for the planned elimination of child labour from the garment sector.

At a press briefing at the embassy. US officials also said that they had contacted the Child Labour Coalition, a USbased organisation which threatened to launch a boycott campaign against Bangladeshi garments, to inform them the BGMEA.

High food prices raise inflation to 4.45 pc

The spiralling food prices pushed the average annual rate of inflation to 4.45 per cent during the July-March period of the current fiscal, compared to only 0.48 per cent in the corresponding period of

RAJSHAHI, May 25: Awami League chief Sheikh Hasina said here today that her party had taken up the Jamuna Multi-purpose Bridge (JMB) project during its rule but imblementation of the project was delayed by 20 years since all the successive governments used the issue for political
