It is also learn that throughout the entire areas, right from sunset until sunrise miking goes on from every mosque without stoppage calling villagers to remain alert

and vigilant in patrolling the villages to catch the invaders courageously and fearlessly. It has become routine duty.

Sources say that lack of law enforcing agency to being situation under control led to this widespread lawlessness, it was widely alleged.
