The candidates had spent all week lobbying for lastditch votes in the Hungarian capital. The final shortlist of four came from an earlier poll among nine original bids, taken by the IOC's executive in Lausanne in January.

Salt Lake City has been trying to win the right to stage the Winter Games for 30 years, Oestersund was making its third successive bid and Sion had also made one previous attempt. Of the candidates, only

Dutch down Scotland

AMSTERDAM, June 17: Dutch captain Wietske de Ruiter scored with a searing corner shot five minutes from time to snatch a 1-0 win over Scotland on Friday, the third day of the women's European Cup, reports Reuter.

Scotland, playing well above their pre-tournament form, seemed to have done enough to earn what would have been their first draw with the Netherlands in 18 years when the Dutch centreforward forced her side's fifth penalty corner of the match. Tracey Robb in the Scot-

tish goal, had made excellent low saves to De Ruiter's earlier shots but this time the Dutch captain found a gap between her feet and the far

Dutch win enabled them to join Spain, the Olympic champions, at the top of Group B with two wins apiece after Spain beat newcomers Sweden 4-().

In the other group, England and Germany share the top spots with two wins apiece after Germany defeated Ireland 4-0 in the day's first match.

The German captain was also her side's match winner with Franziska Hentschel scoring a hattrick for the Ol ympic silver medalists. Germany's other goal, their second, was scored by substitute Vanessa van Kooperen.

Spain found great difficulty in breaking down the inexperienced Swedish defence and led only 1-0 at half time. through Mar Feito.

Maider Telleria scored all three of Spain's second half goals with penalty conversions, two of the strokes were awarded when corner lobs over the Swedish goalkeeper, Liselott Andreason, by Natalia Dorado, the Spanish captain, were illegally stopped on the line by her cover detender.

In the other Group B match, Russia beat the Czech Republic 5-0 after Irina Piskunova had given them a 2-0 half time lead.

International Olympic Com-mittee announced it had overwhelmingly chosen the Utan City as the site for the 2002 Winter Games.

The call was taken by San Francisco 49 years quarterback Steve Young, whose great-great grandfather Brigham Young led the Mormons over the Oregon trail to the Salt Lake valley in the 1840s in search of religious

freedom. Salt Lake bid committee president Tom Welch, in Budapest for the announcement, almost fell over with shock when he saw the results. "Someone has to hold me up," he said.

Dortmund end title drought

BONN, June 17: Borussia Dortmund clinched their first German soccer championship for 32 years with a 2-0 victory over Hamburg and a helping hand from reigning champions Bayern Munich on the last day of the season on Saturday, reports Reuter.

Dortmund, who started the day one point behind leaders Werder Bremen, confidently beat Hamburg with first-half goals from German international midfielder Andy Moeller and teenager Lars Ricken.

Bremen's hopes of a fourth championship in their 96-year history ended when they lost 3-1 at Bayern to finish one point behind.

TOKYO, June 17: Argen/ tine striker Meddina Bello scored twice in the second half, powering the Yokohama Marinos to a 3-1 victory over Gamba Osaka to keep their slim lead as Japan's professional soccer league resumed its first stage Saturday, reports AP.

More than 13,000 spectators at Nagai Stadium in western Japan saw Bello made his first goal five minutes into the second half and his second one with one minute left.

The Kashima Antlers beat Cerezo Osaka 4-2 in a penalty shootout after the two teams struggled to a scoreless tie in the 90-minute regulation period and two 15-minute extra periods.

Italian striker Schillaci fired Jubilo's only goal in the second half.

On goals by Takeo Harada and Hiroki Hattori in the second half, the Yokohama Flugels downed Sanfrecce Hiroshima 2-1 before 15,284 spectators at Hiroshima in western Japan.

Lewis-Fortune bout July 2

LONDON, June 17: Lennox Lewis has his sights set on Mike Tyson and a possible clash between the two former world heavyweight champions which could land the Briton a fortune under a new television deal, reports Reuter.

The British boxer is already assured of one fortune, having signed up to meet Australian Justin Fortune in Dublin on July 2 - an opponent hand-picked because he has a similar style and stature to Tyson.

The 29-year-old Australian is Lewis' first opponent since he stopped Lionel Butler in last month's WBC final eliminator in Sacramento.

Lewis is also lining up a new deal with British satellite television company Sky, which is described as "massive" by his manager, Frank Maloney. But exactly how big this sum will be depends on Lewis meeting Tyson with the WBC crown at stake.

After his Dublin clash, Lewis should face the winner of the Oliver McCall-Frank Bruno title clash in London on July 22 before a possible meeting with Tyson.

Master trainer Emanuel Steward, who is putting Lewis through his paces at his Detroit headquarters, is convinced that the British boxer can beat iron Mike. "Lennox was breathtaking

in his last work-out. I've never seen one of my fighters look so impressive," he said. "I don't think there is a heavyweight in the world who can beat Lennox over 10

rounds, including Tyson."

Tiozzo mauls McCallum



LYON, France, June 17: France's Fabrice Tiozzo stepped out of the shadow of his older brother

Christophe when he beat famaican veteran Mike McCallum to win the WBC light heavyweight boxing title on Friday, reports Reuter.

The 26-year-old Frenchman, who had worked very hard for this fight to make up for his lack of technique, sent McCallum to the canvas in the second round and kept the upper hand through out thanks to his courage and better physical condition.

It was the first time in McCallum's 14 years as a professional that he was counted by the referee. The Jamaican, fighting in

his 17th world title bout, had the better start as Tiozzo was injured to the eyebrow in the first round on a head butt. But despite his experience

and skills, McCallum was far too slow and ill-prepared against a much fitter Tiozzo

who had lost his only previous world title fight against WBA champion Virgil Hill last

More aggressive hitting more often, the Frenchman was given his revenge on an unanimous 115-112, 116-112, and 116-113 decision by the judges amid wild applause from some 8,000 fans.

"The legend is over," said Tiozzo referring to McCallum's 48 professional victo-

vas in the 10th round but kept on fighting bravely until the bell despite an injury to the left eye. Daniels, recording his 34th

career win on an unanimous decision, took the championship belt from compatriot Pernell Whitaker, who has returned to the welterweight ranks.

NEW YORK, June 17: Yes, Mike Tyson, you can go home again but don't expect a hero's welcome.

A planned New York "Welcome Home" bash for the Brooklyn native and convicted rapist, three months out of prison, has left protesters howling, politicians spin-doctoring and organisers backpedaling.

The response to the planned June 20 homecoming - which reportedly was to take the form of a gala festival - was instant and angry, reports AP.

"Be Like Mike?" asked the Wall Street Journal in an editorial. An ad hoc Harlem group, the Committee for Rational African-Americans Against the Parade, complained fiercely. Mayor Rodolph Giuliani, and exprosecutor, condemned the celebration.

And on Wednesday, coalition of African-American leaders — including two City Council members and a former deputy mayor turned out on the steps of City Hall to condemn any plans for a pro-Tyson party.

Hair the final analysis?

LONDON, June 17: Hair analysis could be used to prevent athletes taking drugs to enhance their performance, using a test devised by scientists to monitor the habits of drug addicts, reports AFP.

British researchers have. developed the technique to find traces of drugs such as heroin, ecstasy and cocaine, and they now hope to refine the method so that it can be used to detect steroids, The Daily Telegraph reported to-

The test, developed by researchers at the College of Medecine in Cardiff, Wales, is already being used as evidence in court cases involving drug users, and is said to be "virtually evasion-proof." Sporting organisations are known to be interested.

Drugs circulating in the blood stream bind to a protein called keratin, at the base of the hair shaft, which acts like a recorder, creating a continuous record of drug

Because blood and urine carry drug traces for only three days after use, tests involving these can only detect short-term use. The hair drug is accepted as a reliable method of monitoring drug use over several months.

The England international's transfer, expected to go through on Thursday, has been postponed until next week. Fans have taken the chance to beg Ince and the club to call it off altogether.

Johnny Flacks, vice-chairman of the independent Manchester United supporters' association, said here on Friday the planned sale was too cheap, too soon and short-sighted - and said manager Alex Ferguson had to shoulder part of the blame.

Flacks said: "When you consider Stan Collymore -one and a bit games for England - is about to go between two English clubs for 8.5 million-pounds, then 7 million-pounds for an established international like Paul Ince - the best midfield player in this country — to one of the biggest clubs in Italy, is below the market

Ferguson was told that if he wanted to buy he had to sell first. But he was under no compunction to sell his best players."

ened with forfeiting his title if he fails to agree, is fighting the ruling.

"My prediction is that the Foreman-Schulz fight will not take place," said Jean Marcel Nartz, who helps run the stable of Schulz's manager Wilfried Sauerland
