# 50000 dwellings needed a year

Fifty thousand dwellings are required each year to accommodate the ever growing population of Dhaka city. With the current population of about 8.6 million people, as said by Mayor of Dhaka Mohammed Hanif at The Daily Star BUET Roundtable on 'Save Dhaka' recently, the density is over eight people per room. The number of housing units has not increased to meet the demand.

'Dhaka is bursting at the seams' said Prof Meer Mobasher Ali, Head of the Department of Architecture at the BUET.

According to the President of the institute of Architects, Rabiul Hussain, there is a flood of high rise apartment buildings not meant for the larger section of the city population living at or below poverty level but for the small number of people with higher incomes. There is no proper planning, the city is growing and all are helpless, he added.

A case study on the railroad settlers tells us a horrifying story of the large number of homeless people living on both sides of the rail tracks. These settlers have been living along the tracks from as long ago as 1971. Despite being thrown out on so many occasions, settling persisted.

Shanties were built on

footpaths, with hundreds of poverty stricken people possessing nothing more than the little bit of the footpaths they call their 'homes.' Eight to ten feet of the land along many footpath was taken back demolishing their 'homes' and pushing them further back. Several squats were bulldozed and demolished last year, leaving these people with nothing. Nothing was done to help accommodate the hundreds of poor people living in these squats.
"Human dignity is at its lowest", said Prof Meer Mobasher

The political parties do not have urban housing or land policies. Nothing seems to

have been done to accommodate these people.

The public housing facilities built in the past were mostly for high officials. The designs of these housing units now seem to be proving somewhat of a problem, having used up unnecessarily large spaces. The units built on the basis of current designs, however, are smaller and more compact with rooms kept to a minimum. But are these housing units affordable? May be the lower income group can. But what about the people living in the squats and slums? Can they afford these?

The problems of land and housing availability for the poor have already reached a crisis level. It is not so much the problem of lack of urban land as it is the problem of developing a system to make the land available to the poor in the form of appropriate housing with proper living conditions - hygiene, sanitation and drainage.

## Ershad's defence counsel begins argument

Advocate Yusuf Hossain Humayun, defence counsel of deposed president Hussain Muhammad Ershad told a special judge's court trying the former general in a corruption case that had there been any irregularity in the procurement of relief boats from Japan, the responsibility would have to be shared by all those involved in the whole process, reports BSS.
