"There is a much greater consensus," according to a background document issued here by the G-7 summit organisers, "on the role of the market, economic incentives, and open policies"

So, while the leaders found a need for further international cooperation on the regulation and supervision of the financial markets, they agreed: "Administrative measures, such as selective taxes or controls on capital transactions, are an ineffective and

The leaders — in their Halitax declaration — found there was a need to streamline the policies of individual governments and the effectiveness of the international financial institutions, especially the International Monetary

Pak import, export show upward trend in '94-95

ISLAMABAD, June 18: Pakistan's import and export showed upward trend during 1994-95 which recorded a 16.4 per cent and a 15 per cent increases respectively, reports Xinhua.

According to an official report available here on Saturday, during the nine months of the year, exports registered an increase of 15.2 per cent compared to the corresponding period last year.

The achieve growth was

largely contributed by ex-

ports of rice, cotton yarn, cotton cloth, carpets, hosiery, textile made ups, sports goods, leather and other nontraditional items. The growth of export of rice by 96 per cent in volume terms was partly offset by a

decline in its price by 3.7 per cent. Exports of cotton yarn and fabrics accounted for roughly one third of the total exports.

During the nine months,

imports increased by 16.4 per cent over the corresponding period last year.

All major items except fertilizers, road motor vehicles, tea, artificial silk yarn, milk and milk-food and sugar showed increases of varying

The main items whose imports escalated on account of increase in prices are crude oil. Plastic material and medicinal products reduced quantity.

The items whose quantity as well as price rose included petroleum products, edible oils, wheat, pulses, rubber crude and synthetic fibre.

Machinery imports increased by 13 per cent partly on account of machinery worth 250 million dollars for Hub power project.

Keeping in view the existing trend, the imports for the full year have been estimated at 10.109 billion US dollars. 16.2 per cent higher than last year's level.


