ishahi Sugar mills could not be sold in the current season as the markets have been flooded with the cheaper smuggled Indian sugar.

In the markets of Natore and Rajshahi, Indian sugar is being sold at Taka 25 per kg as against the Taka 30 per kg of locally produced sugar.

This year, North Bengal Sugar Mills of Natore produced highest amount of sugar breaking all previous records out of total 17 sugar mills of the country.

It produced 27,598 metric tons of sugar by crushing 3.40 lakh metric tons of sugarcane against its fixed target of 21.315 metric tons. But 18,341 metric tons of sugar, that is two third of the total, have been lying unsold. The farmer's arrear of this mill is about Taka 3 crore till June

Natore Sugar Mills, second in respect of sugar production out of the country's 17 mills, produced 25,725 metric tons of sugar exceeding its target of 19,140 mts in this season by crushing 3,21,600 mts sugar-

Farmers afrear in this mill is estimated at Taka 9 crore due to the unsold sugar, that is two-third of the total sugar worth Taka 51 crore.

In Rajshahi Sugar Mills, 23,000 mts of sugar were produced against the target of 20,160 mts by crushing 2.93 lakh mts sugarcane in this season. The amount of unsold sugar is 12,492 mts worth Taka 40 crore for which the outstanding bills stand at Taka 3.21 crore till June 15.

### Tk 131cr sugar lying Budget based on realistic BRIEFS assumptions: Saifur

Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman has poured scorn on criticisms of the budget for 1995-96, saying the fiscal measures contained in the budget are based on "realistic assumptions," reports BSS.

"It is not based on unrealistic perceptions or cheap popularity as some people may attempt to see it" he told the representatives of the Overseas Correspondents Association of Bangladesh (OCAB)" in the city yester-

Answering questions on opposition criticism that the budget was formulated eyeing the coming elections, the minister said there is nothing wrong in presenting a budget meant for the coming elections as along as it is pragmatic and designed to bring welfare to the people.

Rahman brushed aside allegations that concessions given the budget may boomerang on the future fiscal policies and said records of

budgets by this government on last few years will also show that it was formulated in the same pattern.

"As a Finance Minister who has presented seven budgets for the nation even by a stretch of imagination will not favour a budget that will tell heavily on the economy next year or later whoever takes over as Finance Minister or whichever government presides," he said. In support of his con-

tention, Rahman gave figures of tax and duties reduction since this government took over and said budget proposals have steadily improved and invigorated to give relief to the people as far as possi-

Asked if the government will issue SRO to increase the prices of different items at later stages, the minister said issuance of SRO is not a healthy thing and it is done only on a situation of unfore-




