## Int'l Day against Drug Abuse observed

The International Day Against Drug Abuse and Drug Trafficking was observed Monday in the country as elsewhere in the world to activate further the campaign against the scourge, reports UNB.

Different socio-cultural organisations of the country organised various programmes to observe the day.

At a function at the Shilpakala Academy auditorium yesterday, Home Minister Abdul Matin Chowdhury called for a concerted effort by people from all walks of life to fight against drug abuse and trafficking. The discussion meeting was organised by the Department of Narcotics Control.

Addressing as a special guest, Home Secretary Azimuddin Ahmed said socioeconomic stability is being threatened by drug addicts. The addiction has crippled a good number of young people of our society, he said. Unemployment, poverty,

frustration and socio-economic disturbances created drug dependency which should be checked with the help of the government as well as international organisations, said Director General of the Department of Narcotics Control Sayed Margoob Morshed.

Earlier, the Department of Narcotics Control brought out a walkathan from Shishu Park at 7:00 am which ended at the Osmany Memorial Hall. Home Minister Abdul Matin Chowdhury led the walkathan.

Radio and TV aired special programmes and newspapers brought out special supplements on the occasion. Several other organisations like Bangladesh Drug Federation of NGOs, Dhaka Ahsania Mission, Bangladesh Association for Social Advancement and National Youth Forum also organised discussion meetings and blood donation programmes.

## Computer aided journalism course in DU soon

A new course on Computer Aided Journalism (CAI) will be introduced at Dhaka University shortly to update the university with the modern communication technol-

Ogy, reports UNB.

Dr A A M S Arefin Siddique, Chairman of the department of Mass Communication and Journalism, disclosed this while talking about the media centre to be set up in the department from the academic season commencing in July this year.

"The main aim of the ini tiative is to link the academic programmes with the explosion of communication technology over the world," Dr Arefin said.

Such a media centre is the first of its kind in the educational institutions of

Bangladesh. "Third year Honours and MA final year students would get the opportunity to work in the centre," the departmental head said.

The first consignment of the materials from lapan and a the United States for this centre has already reached the department, where efforts are afoot to set up the 'news laboratory' for practical training of the students.

It will provide the students with hands on-training in electronic journalism and news editing and would include video facilities for TV production, instruments for radio production and copy editing and page makeup facil-

The centre will be a nonbroadcasting one at the initial stage, the Chairman said, and hoped that it would be able to produce broadcasting material in the future.

It is being established with the assistance of the Asia Foundation and the govern ment of Bangladesh amounting to about Tk one crore.

He submitted that Parliament has no plenary legislative power under Article 65 of the Constitution to confer iudicial power to the courts of settlement. The legislature also cannot take away the judicial powers of the subordinate courts by enacting the Abandoned Buildings Ordinance, he added.

Speakers at a seminar on The future of electronic media in Bangladesh stressed the need for formulating specific guidelines to run the Bangladesh Television (BTV).



Arefin Badal presented a keynote paper titled "Possi-bilities of BTV's package programmes and present problems." Muhammad Jahangir delivered the welcome ad-


Badal Arefin, in his paper, demanded a separate 'package cell' to deal with the package programmes. He also called for separating the entertainment unit from the other units.
