

PARIS, June 27: PLO chief Yasser Arafat's wife Soha is expecting the couple's first child, due in the coming weeks, to be born in Paris, her family said today, reports

But preparations for a family celebration have been marred by the death of her father here on Monday after a long illness.

"If the child is a boy, it will be called 'Ammar' after his father," said a sister of the mother-to-be referring to Yasser Arafat's nom de guerre Abu Ammar. "If it is a girl, she will be called "Zahwa" (after Arafat's mother).

Soha Arafat, 33, has already written a book - pub lished Wednesday — about her own childhood, called "child of Palestine."

In a simple, straightfor ward style, it tells the story of her own childhood, her family's life in British-ruled Pales tine before 1948, and the forthcoming Israeli occupa-
