Seven countries have confirmed their participation in the sixth Commonwealth youth handball championship to be held in Dhaka from August 23 to 31, officials said here yesterday, reports BSS.

"The last date for sending entires is July 15 and we are expecting more countries in the first ever Commonwealth sports meet in Bangladesh, the officials of the Bangladesh Handball Federation told the

agency.
India, Hong Kong, Nigeria and hosts Bangladesh will participate in both the boys' and girls' groups while England and Kenya will take part in only the Boys' group. Besides, Uganda will send a girls' team.

The president of the Commonwealth Handball Association BJ Rowland, secretary general Ishold Williams and president of the Asian Handball Federation Sheikh Ahmed Al-Fahad-Al-Sabah are expected to be in the city during the championship as guests of the Bangladesh Handball Federation.

An executive committee meeting of the Commonwealth Handball Association will be held on August 22 before the formal opening of the meet, the officials said.

The Bangladesh Handball Federation has been running extensive training for the boys' and girls' teams with

the national coaches. Moreover, a coach from Bahrain, sponsored by the Asian Handball Federation, arrives here on July 7 to train Bangladeshi boys and girls for the championship.



While Mohammedans reserve custodian Sayed Hassan Kanan with his bizarre representation proved himself to be some sort of a stoper rather than a goalkeeper.



Sussex worry Windies

HOVE, England, July 2: West Indies finished a week they would be keen to forget on Saturday when Sussex openers Neil Lenham and Keith Newell scored 263 for the first wicket on the opening day of their three-day

match, reports Reuter. Four late wickets by legspinner Rajindra Dhanraj brought some relief to the tourists but the home side still reached 390 for five after six days in which the tourists lost the second Test and then sent home pace bowler Winston Benjamin for disciplinary reasons.

To add to their troubles, Kenny Benjamin left the field mid-afternoon with a bruised tinger while out-of-form skipper Richie Richardson dropped Newell after the Sussex opener had scored only

Newell recorded his maiden first class century in his debut season by top scoring with 135, reached from 235 balls with 15 boundaries.

Lenham was however first into three figures, completing his hundred with successive boundaries off Winston Benjamin's replacement Vasbart Drakes. He was eventually out for 128.

Sussex captain Alan Wells, bidding for a place in the third Test team to meet West Indies in Edgbaston starting on Thursday, failed to make the most of an ideal opportunity by scoring only 21.

Balbo, Sensini foreigners no more

ROME, July 2: Parma and AS Roma were celebrating on Saturday after their Argentine internationals Nestor Sensini and Abel Balbo were recognised by the soccer authorities as Italian citizens, reports

The decision by the Italian Soccer Federation (ISF means that Roma striker Balbo and Parma utility player Sensini would no longer take up one of the precious three places for foreign players in Italian teams for domestic matches.

Roma and UEFA Cup winners Parma have four foreigners each and have had to rotate them.

Balbo and Sensini, who have Italian relatives, have been recongnised officially as Italian citizens for more than five years. But the ISF had still considered them foreigners because they were registered with the Argentine Soccer Federation. "I've been waiting for this


day for a long time," Balbo was quoted as telling Gazzetta dello Sport daily from Buenos Aires, where he scored in Argentina's 2-0 victory over Australia in a friendly on Friday. The ruling is not valid in-

ternationally, however, Sensini and Balbo cannot play as Italians in European events or for the Italian National team.

The ISF also granted Liberian born striker George Weah and Ghanaian born midfielder Abedi Pele European Union (EU) status. Both Weah, who has joined

AC Milan from Paris St Germain, and Torino's Pele are French citizens. But the Italian ruling body had not recognised the fact as they also belonged to non EU soccer federations.

Ray Illingworth, the chairman of selectors and team manager, made the announcement on Sunday at the same time as the squad was named for the third Test starting at Edghaston, Birmingham, on Thursday, reports Reuter

Atherton was originally appointed only for the first three Tests but, following England's victory in the sec-ond Test at Lord's last week, Illingworth and the selectors formally invited him to continue as captain for the rest of the series when they met on Saturday to choose the Edgbatson squad.

"Michael was delighted to accept," added Illingworth. Opener Atherton has led England in 20 of his 47 Tests

since succeeding Graham Gooch two years ago. England's win at Lord's which levelled the series against West Indies 1-1 was Atherton's sixth victory in charge, though he has also lost nine Tests, with five be-

ing drawn. Atherton's Lancashire teammates, Australian-born opener Jason Gallian and all rounder Mike Watkinson, have been named in a squad of 12 for the third Test.

Lancashire skipper Watkinson, who made his country debut in 1982, gets his first international recognition in the middle of an outstanding season.

He has scored 503 county championship runs from only nine innings at an average of 62.87. He has also taken 26 wickets, mainly with his offspin, at an average of 28.96.

Stewart provided a scare on Saturday when he retired hurt after being struck on a finger while batting for Surrey against Middlesex, but Illingworth said he had personally spoken to the batsman-wicketkeeper who reported no problems.
