Indian move to eradicate child labour from carpet industry

NEW DELHI, July 5: The Indian government has made its first tangible move to erac icate child labour from the booming carpet industry but has run into opposition from a leading rights activist, reports AFP.

After denying for years the existence of child labour in the industry, the government has announced that carpets for export would made by adults.

The industry, which in fiscal 1994-95 exported carpets worth 600 million dollars, is backing the move amid increasing worldwide concern. over the exploitation of Indian children in carpet-mak-

India is the world's second largest carpet exporter after

Handicrafts Development Commissioner Ajai Shankar said carpets for export would be issued a 'kaleen' (carpet) label after verification to prove they were not made by children.

There has been an exaggerated campaign abroad about child labour in India Shankar said. The government is committed to ending child labour.

A committee which will include representatives from the government the carpet industry, prominent social activists, the International Labour Organisation and the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) will monitor the system, Shankar said.

The initiative, however, - drawn criticism from a leading child rights activist who charged that it would only cause confusion since a similar labelling system was

already in force since January. The new carpet labelling scheme would create confusion among Western consumers and importers, said Kailash Stayarthi, who heads the South Asian coalition against child servitude.

The older rugmark' label has already become popular, he said. 'More than 50,000 carpets with rugmark labels have already been exported. Buyers abroad now look for rugmark. What was the need for kaleen'?

'We don't oppose the gov-

he added. What we find strange is why the authorities should come up with another system when one is already operating?

Rugmark, which has the backing of the Indo-German export promotion project, was started in January with the industry's half-hearted backing in the wake of widespread allegations of child labour.

Activists say thousands of children from poor families are employed in the manufacture of carpets. The children are paid poor wages and often beaten if they try to escape labour.

The government, which has been stung by criticism that it is not serious about

not discriminate between kaleen and rugmark. But Shankar said: "Kaleen is unanimously supported by all organisations"

The semi-official Carpet Export Promotion Council (CEPC), which has some 3,000 carpet manufacturers and exporters as members, said the kaleen label will be introduced in August.

"Kaleen is a commitment of our member-exporters to eradicate child labour," said CEPC spokesman T S Chandha." It shows the industry and CEPC are concerned about the welfare of children.

He said CEPC members would give an undertaking not to employ children at their looms, agree to monitoring by an independent body.

Benazir to seek Malaysian expertise during visit

KUALA LUMPUR, July 5: Pakistan Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto will seek Malaysian expertise and investment during a three-day visit here, drawing on its fellow Muslim country's strong development record, a report said today, reports AFP.

Bhutto, in an interview with the Local Star daily ahead of her arrival Thursday, said "the main focus of talks will be on economic relations" and hailed Malaysia's rapid economic development.

"Pakistan, on the other hand, is trying to break away from the stranglehold of poverty and social conditions,' she was reported saying.


Bhutto said she would talk to Malaysian businessmen on how Pakistan could provide them with a gateway to Central and Western Asia. She is scheduled to host a

seminar organised by Pakistan's Board of Investment together with the National Chamber of Commerce and Industry Malaysia and the Malaysia-Pakistan Economic Association.

The 41-year-old-Bhutto, who was last here for the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) in 1989, is also expected to speak at Malaysia's Institute of Diplomacy and Foreign Relations.

In the interview, she said Pakistan's foreign policy was finally "being determined solely by its own interests rather than on the whims of major powers."

Pakistan's Export Promotion Board will hold a fourday exhibition in conjunction with Bhutto's visit to showease the country's products.

LONDON, July 5: Barings executives in London gave evidence against the trader who allegedly caused the bank's collapse, and against each other during voluntary questioning by Singapore investi-gators, the Guardian reported today, says AFP.

It said that Barings staff in Britain were anxious to tell their versions of the merchant bank's collapse, after it be came clear to them that other colleagues had come forward This was despite the fact

that the Singapore investigators had no legal power to force anyone in Britain to answer questions, the paper said.

The Singapore investigators probing the Barings failure were reported in May to be nearing the end of their enquiry

Barings trader Nick Leeson ran up billions of dollars worth of debt dealing in derivatives, which allegedly caused the bank to collapse on February 26.

BCCI scandal Touche Ross revises suit

LONDON, July 5: Touche Ross, the firm acting as liquidator to the collapsed Bank of Credit and Commerce International (BCCI), has reduced its 11 billion dollar claim against the bank's former auditors, the Financial Times reported yesterday, says AFP.

In what the paper dubbed a secret move, Touche Ross is believed to have revised its suit against the accountancy firms Price Waterhouse and Ernst and Youn GTO between three and four billion dollars.


