

ing the World Cup. It will never be up for discussion. At least, we on the Japanese side, will never make such an offer," said Shunichiro Okano, vice chairman of the Japan Football Association, quoted in press reports Okano said that world body FIFA

rules stipulated that all the games of the World Cup finals should be played within the country FIFA named to "It's not easy to revise the rules

that FIFA has observed for decades Besides, there's no time to do so,' Okano said.

2002 World Cup will be decided at a FIFA board of directors meeting early next year.

South Korea, which has qualified for the last three World Cup finals as well as qualifying in 1954, sees the World Cup as an way of boosting its infrastructure, as with the Seoul

Olympics in 1988. However, Japan, which pleased FIFA by making such a success of its


