The Court had earlier notified eight leading lawyers to get their opinion on the issue. They are: SR Pal, Barrister Ishtiaq Ahmed, Dr Kama Hossain, Khandaker Mahbub Uddin Ahmed, Rafiqul Huq, SC Bar Association President T H Khan, government-appointed lawyer Barrister Ashrarul Hossain and the Attorney

General. Dr Kamal, one of the framers of the country's Constitution, said that the issue could be settled under Article 67(1) (b) of the Constitution and 178 (3) of the Rules of procedure of Parliament which clearly stated the provisions on the matter.

During his more than one hour submission since 11:45am, Dr Kamal cited examples from the supreme courts of USA, India and Canada. He said in 1793, the US Supreme Court declined to give advisory opinion on a reference made by president George Washington.

Earlier, when the court began the hearing at 9:10 am, Barrister Ashrarul Hossain elaborated different points mentioned in the Presidential refer-

He said that the boycott of Parliament sessions which started on March 1, 1994 should not be construed as absence within the meaning of Article 67(1)(b).

A Member of Parliament can seek leave of absence from the House if he falls sick or he needs to go abroad for a long time or for any other personal reason, he pointed out.

"The absence which crippled parliament was not contemplated in Article 67(1)(b)," he said, adding, "The absence was made purposefully to make Parliament ineffective, so the 'absence' should not be construed as 'absence' within the meaning of the relevant Article."

He said that they first staged a walk out with the intention that they would come back to the House. But they started boycotting the sessions on the demand for a caretaker government, he added.

Four of the five judges asked various questions regarding the definitions and meaning of 'sitting', 'sitting days', 'boycott', 'walkout', 'absence', 'consecutive' and 'continuous' to get the views of Barrister Ashrarul

Justice Mostafa Kamal asked how would you determine the period of walkout and boycott and how long a walkout or boycott could continue.

He also asked "If I say walkout should not be construed as absence how can I count 90 days?"

Justice Mostafa Kamal also said there may be reasons for a walkout which may be unreasonable to others. But it does not concern an MP who staged the walkout as he may be ready to face the electoral consequence during the byelection.

Justice Latifur asked how the functioning of Parliament was made impossible? So far the rule is concerned presence of 60 members can make the quorum and the proceedings may continue, he added.

Chief Justice ATM Afzal said that there was a practice of walkout in Parliamentary system but was there any practice of 'star away'. At one stage, the matter was

placed before the Chair for an opinion. But the Chair said "We will give our opinion but we are trying to get vour views." SR Pal said that the facts of the

NARAYANGANJ, July 16: Three policemen were stabbed, one of them seriously when they attempted to apprehend some extortionists in the Chashara railgate area of the town
