# First goal, first win



# Eric & Ferguson's book



17: Eric Cantona pledged his future to Manchester United by signing a pay-

Trafford club when he agreed a new contract in April, manager Alex Ferguson reveals in a book to be published later this week, reports AFP.

Ferguson also admits in the book that at one stage he was resigned to losing Cantona, with Inter Milan pressing hard to take him to Italy.

The Frenchman's future with United hung in the balance last February when he was suspended until October and find 10,000 pounds by the Football Association for his now infamous attack on a Crystal Palace fan.

But he agreed to stay with United by signing a new contract which will keep him at Old Trafford until 1998 and it was the player himself who suggested that the deal should be tied to appear-

ances. The unusual arrangement is revealed in Ferguson's new book "A Year in the Life," extracts from which were published in The Mail on Sunday.

"The new contract reflects the situation, the need for Eric to play and, in fairness," he suggested that the pay should be tied to him playing.

# Last laugh Romario's

SAO PAULO, July 17: Van derlei Luxemburgo, coach of Brazilian club Flamengo, has been sacked following a series of clashes over training methods with top striker Romario, the Globo newspaper reported, reports Reuter

Brazil's World Cup hero Romario was quoted as saying: "He is a great coach but the methods he used in one team may not work in another one.

"Flamengo are different from Palmeiras," he said, referring to Luxemburgo's previous team.

In return, Luxemburgo had called Romario "lazy and indisciplined."

"I have in my hands one of the best players in the world, and one of the laziest as well," Luxemburgo said re-

He also said he was sure he would remain in charge of Flamengo until the end of the vear.

"He will receive a basic wage and then we will pay him appearance money — an extra fee for each match he plays.

"If he doesn't play, there's top officials. as-you-play deal with the Old no extra money. I'm quite enthusiastic about it all." Ferguson added.


But Ferguson also reveals his fears about Cantonas future at the club after the assault which led to him being sentenced to 120 hours of community service, Ferguson adds. "I could not imagine Eric being able to play for the club again. I was worried about the consequences if he returned to Old Trafford after the suspension and did

something similar again. "It would destroy my credibility and United's good name, and it would really finish him as a player. I really felt we had to let him go." he

However, United lawyer Maurice Watkins persuaded Ferguson to keep Cantona after a meeting of the club's

The United boss reveals. "My initial feeling was for letting Eric go. I have supported Eric through thick and thin but I felt this time that the good name of Manchester United demanded strong action. "The club is bigger than any indiyidual, I related that to the board and they agreed.

"As the meeting went on my view began to change and I accepted Maurice's argument that we should not turn our backs on one of our players in a situation where everybody else was going to be against him. If Eric was going to leave it had to be of his own accord," he adds.
