YANGON, July 19: Myan mar and China have singed an agreement covering the purchase of machinery and equipment to renovate Myanmar's dilapidated shipvards and improve their efficiency, the official press reported vesterday, says AFP.

The Myanmar government operates five shipyards, most of them more than 100 years old, which can barely come with the present workload. including building 72 new vessels. The New Light of Myanmar said.

"Installation of the new machinery will help build and repair the vessels more, efficiently and thereby contributes to better transport services, the daily quoted Transport Minister Lieu tenant General Thein Win as saying.

Under an accord singed Monday, China's Yunan Machinery Import and Export Corp is to provide five million dollars worth of machinery and equipment to modernize and upgrade the shipyards.

## Indian railways team begins talks in Baghdad

BAGHDAD, July 19: A delegation from the Indian railways on Tuesday began talks in Baghdad on how to meet lrag's rail transport needs. Iraqi officials said, reports

### Lanka may set up commodities futures exchange

COLOMBO, July 19: The Sri Lankan government is considering the establishment of a commodities futures exchange in Colombo, official sources said today reports Xinhua.

Such an exchange will primarily be aimed at obtaining better prices for producers and creating more employment opportunities.

The principal purpose of the exchange will be for buyers and sellers to trade commodities for future delivery in a controlled and systematic manner.

This will also prevent producers being affected by price fluctuations.

# US trade deficit widens

WASHINGTON, July 19: The US deficit on trade in goods and services edged up unexpectedly to a record 11.43 billion dollars in May as the country's oil bill rose sharply, the Commerce Department said on Tuesday, reports Reuter. The May gap was a slight

0.1 per cent above the 11.42 billion dollars deficit of April. which had been a monthly record, exports rose 1.3 per cent to 64.81 billion dollars while imports advanced 1.1 per cent to a record 76.24 billion dollars.

Economists had expected a 10.4 billion dollars deficit for May. Economic weakness among the nation's major trading partners has limited demand for US goods.

The country's deficit in merchandise trade shrank one per cent to 16.48 billion dollars from 16.55 billion dollars in April as the country exported goods worth 47.76 billion dollars in May and imported 64.24 billion dollars worth.

The growth of imports was led by purchases of oil and petroleum products. which shot up by 17.3 per cent in May to 4.93 billion dollars crude oil imports alone rose 15 per cent to 4.05 billion dollars the highest level since the Gulf War buildup in November 1990, and foreign crude prices rose for the fifth consecutive month to 17.39 dollars a bar-

rel, the department said. The politically sensitive deficit in merchandise trade with Japan shrank by 6.4 per cent to 5.5 billion dollars in May, but the shortfall so far this year of 27.07 billion dollars was still 8.6 per cent higher than the same fivemonth period in 1994.

The United States and Japan recently struck a deal to give wider access to US auto and auto-parts manufacturers to the huge Japanese market.

But another trade confrontation looms over Japan's refusal to grant Federal Express a new air-cargo route. The Clinton administration is threatening to place limits on Japanese air-cargo carriers.

The United States typi-

eally runs a surplus on trade with other countries in services like travel and tourism that partly offsets big merchandise trade deficits.

But the US surplus in service trade shrank by 1.4 per cent in May to 5.06 billion dollars as exports were unchanged at 17.05 billion dollars and imports rose slightly to 11.99 billion dollars.

In merchandise trade with struggling Mexico, the US deficit widened 10.5 per cent to 1.63 billion dollars in May and was 6.93 for the first five months of the year, compared with a 885 million dollars surplus in the same 1994 period.

The shortfall with western Europe more than doubled to 960 million dollars from 418 million dollars in April, but in trade north of the border. the United States' deficit with Canada, its single largest trading partner, shrank 24.5 per cent to 1.18 billion dol-

## 'Jute yarn bank' may be set up in W Bengal

CALCUTTA, July 19: The West Bengal Small Industries Corporation (WBSIC) has been asked to immediately set up a 'jute yarn bank' mainly to meet the requirements of jute based units in the state in view of the mills reluctance to sell jute yarn to these units depending on vagaries of the markets and traders' manipulations, reports PTI.

State's Cottage and Small-Scale Industries Minister, Prabir Sengupta, said that the bank would start initially with one MT of each of six varieties of jute yarn purchased from the mills. The centre has also been requested to finance the WBSIC to develop its own "working capital rolling fund" which is expected to cross a monthly runover or 100 lakh rupees shortly as more and more jute based units are to come up with state government's encouragement.

Reviewing the state of affairs in the jute-diversified

products' sector which has been lagging in the state. Sengupta said here vesterday 'that this sector produced 100 crore rupee worth of products, of which West Bengal's share was only one-third and, exports account of the state was 'negligible.'

The minister said that the 'Tantu A', Tantushree and Khadi Board had been advised to organise existing jute-based units and popularise this sector to attract new entrepreneurs and selfemployed persons as also to organise their marketing to attain turnover of 300 crore rupees within one to two years, with significant export earnings.

The state government has fixed a target of setting up at least 1,000 jute-based new units for 1995-96 against existing 150, for which funding through the financial institutions and loans from West Bengal Finance Corporation and State Cooperative Bank were being finalised.


