



Olsen to make a move

OSLO. July 23: Egil Olsen said on Saturday that he would guit as coach of Norway's national soccer team if he received an offer from a top team in England or elsewhere, reports Reuter.

Olsen, 53, said in an interview with the Verdens Gang Daily that his Norwegian team were about to reach their potential and that he wanted to look abroad for new challenges.

"I really would like to try my soccer philosophy on a foreign club with many good individualists. That would be fun," said Olsen, whose contract with the Norwegian Soccer Federation expires in August 1996.

"If I were to get an offer from a club in, say, England. Spain or Portugal, it would be hard to go for another two years with Norway."

Olsen, who has been national coach for some five years, enters negotiations for a two-year extension of his contract with the federation in a few days, Verdens Gang said.

Olsen, whose tactics include an iron-clad defence couple, with breakaway attacks, guided Norway to the World Cup finals.

changes to the 1996 Olympic athletics schedule to help Michael Johnson in his bid for a 200m and 400m double. Dave Maggard of the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games said here on Saturday, reports AFP. Maggard, the managing

director of sport for the Games, said the competition schedule had been completed for all sports, including athletics.

"We're putting on the Games for the world, not just for the United States athletes, not just for one particular athlete," Maggard said at a press conference during the US Olympic

Johnson had asked that the schedule be changed so that one of the events would be completed before heats in the other began. Otherwise, he said, attempting the double would be too difficult.

The International Amateur Athletic Federation has already added 50 minutes between the 200m semifinals and 400m finals, giving Johnson a 2hr 35min break between two races.

Maggard said that as far as he knew the IAAF would not agree to further changes, even if Johnson does the double at the World Championships in Gothenburg. Sweden, next month.

"What I have been told in all my conversations with the IAAF is that this is the final schedule," he said.

"What the very direct comments made to me and my staff have been is, 'his is the schedule. There will be no further changes to the schedule," he said.
