Shrimp fry traders facing problem in Cox's Bazar

COX'S BAZAR, July 25: Shrimp fry traders of the district have been facing serious problem in selling their item as the truck owners and workers were resisting transportation through microbus. reports UNB.

It was known that the traders preferred microbus for fast transportation of the fries. But the truck-owners have been demanding that they will carry the item.

The traders said they could not collect sufficient fries for hiring a truck and it requires much time. Moreover, a huge number of fries damaged during transportation by truck causing heavy loss to them.

On the other hand, transportation through microbus consumes less time and its cost is also comparatively low, they said.

Due to the impasse, the price of shrimp fries has sharply fallen. A huge quantity of shrimp fries remained unsold daily due to the transportation problem.

The district is surplus in shrimp fries and every day 15 to 20 lakh shrimp fries are being sold here.

Knowledgeable sources said it the problem continues the shrimp cultivation in other districts will be greatly hampered.

ADB suggests SAARC countries' cooperation in energy sector

Resident Representative of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) Bhanuphol Horavangura has advocated stronger regional cooperation in the energy sector for the benefit of SAARC countries. reports UNB.

Tremendous scopes exist for exchange of hydro power and gas among the countries of the region. Horayangura said at a luncheon meeting of the Foreign investors Chamber of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) at a local hotel yesterday.

Referring to an on-going cooperation move by some South East Asian countries. including China, Laos. Myanmar, Thailand and Vietnam, the ADB executive was critical of slow progress in regional ties in South Asia. SAARC has not really gone

far", he said. FICCI President Mahbub Jamil conducted the meeting attended by representatives from different foreign com-

Turning to Bangladesh, the ADB representative said a distorted international image had been critical for the country holding back the inflow of foreign private investment.

"Dhaka seriously suffers from bad image. Not everything being perceived outside about the country is true. It's a good place to work and to live in. Lot of things have changed over the years but image remains basically the same," said Horayangura, a frequent visitor to Bangladesh since the mid

Referring to a poor 175 million US dollars of foreign direct "investment in Bangladesh in 1993, he observed image was a major

The ADB official urged foreign companies operating here to promote Bangladesh's image in their countries. "You (foreign companies) have a major role to

Horayangura said ADB was also making effort to help Bangladesh recover from bad image by collaborating with its effort for policy reforms.

The ADB representative made a positive appraisal of Bangladesh's progress towards a private sector led economy. He particularly referred to privatization of

progress in railway restruc-

Horayangura, however. was critical of the functioning of the power sector where, he said, system loss was running at 40 per cent and unrealised revenue amounted to seven months' bill.

Saying that ADB was promoting private sector participation in power sector, he said the bank was investing 50 million US dollars in a 80 MW power plant in Mymensingh.

Another funding proposal, also amounting 50 million dollars, for a 300 MW generation plant in Meghna Ghat by a private company is under consideration, he said.

Talking about ADB's participation in development of Horayangura said business climate in Bangladesh would significantly improve with the completion of Jamuna bridge. "There will be more business opportunities in the country being unified by the bridge", he said.

ADB, the Manila-based multilateral funding institution, has so far provided Bangladesh with five billion US dollars in soft term development loan during its 24 years of operation here. In addition, the bank has provided some 100 million dollars of grant as technical assistance.

ADB loans are interestfree while a nominal one per cent service charge is levied. Repayment period is 40-year plus a 10 per cent grace pe-

BSRS resumes term lending today

Bangladesh Shilpa Rin Sangstha (BSRS), the staterun industrial credit corporation, resumes its term lending today (Wednesday) after facing a decade-long embargo on providing loans to new projects, reports

The resumption of lending by the BSRS, heavily burdened with outstanding, is expected to fill in a vacuum in long-term industrial investment, officials said.

Authorities recently allowed BSRS to sanction longterm industrial loans, lifting the embargo imposed in mid-1980s under an accord between the government and some development partners.

The accord signed in March 1985 reduced the activities of BSRS into providing financial assistance only or balancing, modernisation, replacement and expansion (BMRE) of the industrial units in its portfolio.

After prolonged debates on whether the Sangstha will be privatised or act as a fullfledged development finance institution (DFI), the government decided to allow the public sector lender to resume its activities as DFI.

The government provided Tk 1,750 million as credit to the Sangstha in 1994 for its reorganisation. In January this year, the Cabinet gave a go-ahead signal to BSRS to act as a full-fledged development finance institution.

According to official sources, the poor performance of the Sangstha, particularly in case of recovery, prompted the government to put an embargo on its lending activities.

As the Sangstha showed signs of improvement in its recovery performance and sanction of loans for BMRE and rehabilitation of sick units in last two fiscal years, the government abandoned its privatisation move and lifted the embargo.

The BSRS recovered a total of Tk 522 million from today.

During 1994-95 fiscal, the Sangstha approved rescheduling and restructuring of 41 industrial units, including 28 sick units, in order to make them financially viable and operationally profitable.

The Sangstha approved rescheduling and restructuring of 28 industrial units, including 14 sick industries, in 1993-94, according to official statistics.

The amount of loan sanctioned by BSRS grew by 47 per cent in 1994-95 over the previous year. As it has fully repaid all

previous loan obligations, BSRS has no outstanding debt obligations to the donors and no overdue to the government. The Sangstha has also

paid an amount of Tk 1.534.91 million to the government as income tax and contribute Tk 111.68 million to national exchequer from its profit.

Asian stock markets close mixed

HONG KONG, July 25: Asian stock markets closed mixed Tuesday, with share prices plunging in Tokyo after three days of advances, reports AP.

Tokyo's 225-issue Nikkei Stock Average fell 443.10 points; or 2.67 per cent, closing at 16,148.40. On Monday, the index had risen 2.41 points, or 0.01 per cent.

The Tokyo Stock Price Index of all issues listed on the first section was, down 22.60 points, or 1.71 per cent, to 1,299.86. It had gained 4.22 points, or 0.32 per cent, on Monday.

Traders said share prices fell because of the US dollar's continued weakness against the Japanese yen.

The perception that the Japanese government was not doing enough to support the economy and discouraging statistics announced by the government's Economic Planning Board also contributed to the decline.

Meanwhile, the dollar was quoted at 87.50 yen in late trading, down 0.38 yen from late Monday in Tokyo but above 87.45 yen late Monday in New York. Share prices also tumbled

in Taiwan, with brokers saying investors were worried about rising tensions with China because of Chinese missile tests in the East China Sea. The Taipei exchange's

Weighted Price Index fell 139.70 points, or 2.7 per cent, to 4,994.70. It was the first time that the index had slipped below 5,000 points in two and a half years. HONG KONG: Share pri-

ces closed solidly higher on bargain-hunting. The Hang Seng Index, the market's key indicator of blue chips, rose 71.06 points, or 0.8 per cent, closing at 9,359.10. On Monday, the index had slumped 122 points.
