

Diarrhoea spreading fast in flood affected areas

Diarrhoea has broken out in most of the flood-hit districts including Dhaka following the recession of flood wa-

According to the Central Control Room at the Directorate of Health, 11 diarrhoeal deaths were reported in the last one week and some 9.045 people were attacked with the disease in 32 districts. Noakhali and Dhaka being the worst affected. During the last seven

days, 1552 people were attacked with diarrhoea in Neakhali, followed by 1356 in Dhaka, said Dr Sayed Shahinoor Rahman, Medical Officer at the control room. which monitors the situation and sends report everyday to

the Prime Minister's Office and the Health Ministry.

The control room recorded one diarrhoeal death in Pabna yesterday and 915 other cases of attack:

WASHINGTON. Aug 2: The US House of Representatives, following a similar move by the Senate last we-ek, voted Tuesday to unilaterally lift the arms embargo

on Bosnia, reports AFP.

Approved by a margin of 298-128, the bill sets up a confrontation between Congress and President Bill Clinton, who has vowed to veto the measure.

Once the President imposes his promised veto, the Congress could then take a subsequent vote to override Clinton's action, but it would take a two-thirds majority in each House to pass it over his objection.
