## Hattestad too heavy to compete

GOTHENBURG, Sweden, Aug 2: Norway's Trine Hattestad said on Tuesday she would not defend her javelin title at the World Athletics Championship because she was five months pregnant and "too heavy" to compete, reports Reuter.

Hattestad, 29, who has been performing regularly on the Grand Prix circuit this summer, told the Norwegian daily newspaper Verdans Gang: "I am sorry, but" I am too heavy."

Hattestad won the world title in Suttgart in 1993 and followed up with the European crown in Helsinki last year.

She would have been among the favourites to win again in Sweden.

Already a mother with a four-year-old son, she added: What I don't have is an Olympic gold and I will make a major effort to get that in Atlanta next year.

"After I have the baby I will have seven months to go before the Olympics and that should be plenty of time." Germany's Uta Pippig, a

MUNICH. Aug 2: Using voice comparisons, police have arrested a man accused of threatening tennis star Boris Becker and Becker's manager, police said

Tuesday, reports AP. Becker took the threats seriously and kept his wife and young son out of Germany for months last year as over 20 calls making threats and demanding money went to the Munich office of his manager. Axel

Police said the suspect. whose name was not released, is a 28-year-old resort workers who confessed to the campaign of threats after becoming a suspect in another extortion case.

Police had recorded one of the threatening calls to Mayer-Woelden's office and matched the caller's voice with that of the suspect, said a statement from Munich police headquarters. It said the man was arrested last Thursday, and a judge issued an order to hold him in jail pending trial.

The calls began in March 1994 and continued until February this year, the police statement said.

### Morceli, Kiptanui marks ratified

GOTHENBURG, Aug 2: Two world records set last month by Algerian Noure ddine Morceli and another set by Kenyan Moses Kiptanui in June were all ratified by the International Amateur Athletic Federation on Tuesday, reports Reuter.

The IAAF officially recognised the 2.000 metres time of four minutes 47.88 seconds set by Morceli in Paris "Some delegates believe on July 3, and his run of in Nice on July 12.

The IAAF also officially recognised Kiptanui's 5.000 metres time of 12:55.30 set in Rome on June 8 and the junior world 5.000 metre mark of 12:56.15 set by Kenyan Daniel Komen in the same race.
