29983 illegal immigrants held in Malaysia

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 5 Malaysia detained 29,983 il legal immigrants in the first seven months of the year, officials say, reports AP.

The undocumented for eigners were picked up by the government task force on illegal immigration in two major operations in and around Kuala Lumpur, according to Ahmad Bakhtiar Sulaiman, who heads the enforcement agency.

Ahmad Bakhtiar said most of them were detained in raids on workers' dormitories at construction sites and factory areas in and around the capital.

CHITTAGONG, Aug 5: A P-3 Orion patrol aircraft of US Navy landed at Chittagong airport this morning, said an ISPR press release.

The aircraft, carrying 21 crew members has come from the US naval base in Diago Garcia and will be staying here till August 12.

The crew members were received by officials of the US embassy and officers of Bangladesh Navy.

The aircraft has come in advance to take part in the joint Bangladesh-US naval exercise in the Bay of Bengal. A war ship of the US Navy is scheduled to reach the outer anchorage here on August 7 for the exercise.

The aircraft will keep surveillance from the sky during the joint exercise.

The exercise will focus on cooperation between the US and Bangladesh forces in the field of sea surveillance. search and rescue operations during natural disasters.

Minar, a student of Model Kindergarten in the city. started groaning after an attending nurse pushed an anti-tetanus injection, Tetanol, in her body at about 8 pm in preparation for an operation. She died after some time, the sources said.

Her relatives said she was already dead when doctors on duty and the Ward Surgeon rushed to attend

According to her death certificate. Minar died "possibly due to drug reaction". The general anesthesia report said she was fit for operation. She was due to be operated upon today.

Minar's relatives said pushing a "wrong injection" might have caused her death. The injection was pushed about half an hour after opening the ample, they alleged. The nurse fled the ward soon after Minar had died.

Director of the hospital Col. Labib Uddin Khan said a three-member committee has been formed to ascertain the cause of the death and submit its report within a week.

The members of the committee are: Dr Khokon Kanti Das, Dr Shamsul Alam and Dr Zillur Rahman.


