CALCUTTA, Aug 6: If India could sustain its current rate of growth in export, it could achieve a total export figure of 72 billion US dollars by 2001, which in turn would give it a one per cent share of global trade, according to Shyamal Ghosh, the Director General of Foreign Trade, says PTI.

While participating in an interaction with the exporting community organised by the Foreign Trade Association (eastern India) and Bengal Chamber of Commerce and industry. Ghosh said that this would be possible if the country adds an additional

one billion dollar of export over the target of five billion dollar in the current year and then goes on adding an additional one billion dollar every subsequent year.

The country had an export figure of 26 billion dollar in 1994-95 and for the current year the target is 31 billion dollar.

Ali Ibn Ibrahim Al-Mouaimi, former head of the state oil company Aramco. replaced Hisham Nazer, who had held the oil portfolio since King Fahd sacked the former oil minister Sheikh Ahmad Zaki Yamani in October 1986.

"I do not expect any change in the kingdom's oil policies with the appointment of a new oil minister because such a policy is virtu-

ally in the hands of the King and his ruling family," a Gulfbased oil executive said.

"The King fired Yamani because he was trying to follow an independent course away from the Royal family. This means that the minister of oil in Saudi Arabia should simply carry out the King's orders.

Saudi Arabia is the biggest crude producer and exporter in the world, with its output accounting for around 12 per cent of the world's total oil production. It also controls more than a quarter of the world's oil reserves and at the current output level of eight million barrels per day


