Low-lying areas in Chawkbazar, Katalganj, Agrabad, Chaktai, Bakalia, Bibirhat, Raozan, Fatikchhari, Anwara and Banghkhali - have gone under water. Met office recorded 147 mm rainfall during the last 27 hours ending out 9 pm yesterday.

Traffic was thin on the roads and highways while people were forced to stay indoors.

Supply of essentials to the city's markets were also affeeted, traders said.

### Govt urged to fully endorse UN convention on women

Leading women activists vesterday urged the government to endorse all clauses of the UN Convention for Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) before the next World Conference on Women in Beijing.

Briefing newsmen about the National Convention of the CEDAW sub-committee in Bangladesh starting today. the sub-committee joint convenor Jahanara Haq said the Bangladesh government is one of the signatories of the CEDAW except clauses 2, 13(A), 16(A) and (F).

"We want the government to endorse all the clauses before the Beijing conference for ensuring equality of women in our country," said the joint convenor of the CEDAW sub-committee for National Preparatory Committee of the Beijing NGO Forum '95 at a press conference at the National Press Club auditorium. "If necessary the laws must be reformed or changed to ensure women's equality," she added.

Other members of the CEDAW sub-committee present at the press briefing at the National Press Club, were chairperson Prof Nazma Chowdhury, Rasheda K Chowdhury, Maleka Begum, Ayesha Khanam and Shaheen Anam. They asked for the "spirit of the Constitution to be reflected in the treatment of women in this country." and termed today's conference a "Conference of
