grows' NEW DELHI. Aug 13: Despite a booming 'grey market in the personal computer segment, India's information technology (IT) industry registered a 44 per cent growth during 1994-95 by posting a turnover of 6.840.88 crore rupees, says an annual survey of the industry, reports PTI.

The survey, carried out among 700 companies, reports that during the last five years, the segment had a compounded annual growth rate of 26 per cent, placing the industry amongst the fastest-growing segments in the Indian economy.

'Dataquest', a leading computer magazine which conducted the annual industry survey, says that nearly 2.34 lakh personal computers were sold in India during last fiscal year, registering a 45 per cent growth in value.

In the personal computers segment, the 486 class of systems displayed a meteoric rise - registering 244 per cent growth. But 386 based systems, while increasing in numbers, actually showed a negative growth in value and in market share.

It has predicted that during the current fiscal year. 386 systems will get all but phased out and the pentium class of machines will rise.

However, 486 systems will consolidate its position amongst the corporate buyers and the small office buyers, the survey says.

Barings collapse

Lesson can make up \$4.7m from media deals

LONDON, Aug 13: Nick Leeson, the lormer trader at the heart of the collapse of Britain's oldest merchant bank Barings, could make up to three million pounds (4.7 million dollars) from media deads. The Sunday Times said reports Reuter.

The newspaper said publishers and broadcasters were clamouring to tell the rag to riches-to-rags tale of the 28 year-old, who is fighting extradition to Singapore where he lares 12 charges of traud, forgery and illegal transfer of funds. He is currently being held in Germany.

Hanoi ministry issues decree Make deep cuts in expenses for conferences


HANOL Aug 13: The Vietnamese government has called for a fresh round of economy measures from the state sector in a bid to avoid waste and trim a serious budget deficit, the official media reported here vesterday, reports AFP.

The finance ministry issued a decree this week calling on central and local administrations, the armed forces, public companies and unions to make deep cuts in their expenses for conferences and receptions.

The measures are aimed at cutting down on the number of conferences and seminars, halting the practice of giving presents and cash 'Last year the country

spent almost 500 billion dong (50 million US dollars) on conferences and receptions. The ministry decree also told delegates not to consume alcohol or smoke cigarettes at official functions.

Vietnam has great difficulty in raising revenue. chiefly because of tax evasion. Government services chief Le Xuan Trinh said recently that budget receipts for the first six months of the year were only 39 per cent of the amount expected.

Jakarta's income from plywood exports drops

JAKARTA, Aug 13: Income from Indonesian plywood exports dropped five per cent to 1.97 billion dollars for the first semester of 1995 as world prices fell, the press reported here yesterday, reports AFP.

Executive Chairman of the Association of Indonesian Wood Panel Producers (Apkindo). Cipto Wigjoprajitno. said that the income drop came despite a one per cent increase in export volume to 4.49 million cubic metres compared to the first semester of 1994.

Indonesian plywood accounts for some 80 per cent of the world market.

Wigjoprajitno, quoted by The Jakareta Post daily, said he was optimistic that prices would improve.

In June 1995, Trade Minister Billy Yudono called for a review of the plywood marketing system in view of declining exports but the producers rejected the suggestion. Critics abroad have ac-

cused the association of dumping in a bid to earn market share overseas. But Wigjoprajitno denies this.

Local opponents to the concentrated marketing system, have accused it of monopolistic practices.


