Fire victims to be rehabilitated

RANGAMATI, Aug 18: In collaboration with the Deputy Commissioner and chairman of Rangamati municipality, the Rangamati Hill District Local Government Council (RHDLGC) has started rehabilitating the fire victims of Islampur, an outskirt habitation in the municipality area affected on August 13 last. Parizat Kusum Chakma, Chairman of RHDLGC said.

Rebuilding of the 17 families dwelling houses which were burnt to ashes in a fire havoc that broke out on August 3 last will be completed by August 20, Parizat added.

Fire originated from the oven of a house, 17 dwelling houses were consumed in Islampur village of Rangamati municipality on August 3 last. The local fire brigade forces who controlled the fire estimated the loss worth Taka three lakh.

Islampur, a new habitation, was raised by the CHT Dev Board to rehabilitate the destitute who came to Rangamati town early this year.

Two fighting for life after receiving bullet injuries

KAUKHALI (Rangamati), Aug 18: A man and his wife are fighting for life in Chittagong Medical College Hospital sustaining bullet injuries after coming under gunfire by the dacoits on August 8 at East Monapara village in Kaukhali thana of the district, police and hospital sources said.

A gang of about 8 to 10 bandits armed with lethal weapons and fire arms, swooped on the house of Bidhu Bushan Barua.

The bandits opened fire on Bidhu Bushan and his wife Malati Rani Barua when the couple resisted them.

On hearing the sound of gun-shots and hue and cry of the victims, the neighbours rushed for help and chased the bandits and caught four of them with one country-made gun and two rounds of bullets while fleeing. The other dacoits of the gang managed to flee, the police said quoting the villagers as saying.

A case was lodged with Kaukhali thana police in this connection.

Removal of madrasa superintendent demanded

BANDARBAN, Aug 18: Demanding the removal of superintendent, the students of Bandarban Islamia Madrasa brought out a procession in the town. Declaring to boycott the classes for an indefinite period, agitating students locked the entire madrasa including the office-room of the superintendent.

The student leaders in the rally said, since 1991 they are demanding the removal of Maulana Shihabuddin, the superintendent of the madrasa, who has allegedly been misusing his official powers and involved in corruption.

The student leaders further said that they were compelled to go for agitation as the authority failed to take their longstanding and legitimate demands.

Construction of two-km road in progress

KHAGRACHHARI, Aug 18: The work on a road between Longodu and Mohalchhari thanas is going on in full swing in the district, reports UNB.

According to the Hill Tracts Development Board, the two-km road is being constructed from town area of Mohalchhari to Singinali, the other side of Chengi river, at a cost of Taka one crore.

A 300 feet bailey bridge will also be constructed on the river to establish direct communication between the two thanas.

The board spent Tk 35 lakh from special allotment for the hill tract area in the last fiscal year and the rest Tk 65 lakh will be spent in the current fiscal year, official sources said.

After the completion of the project, about one and a half lakh people of Naniarchar, Mohalchhari, Longodu and Borkol thanas of Khagrachhari and Rangamati districts will enjoy better communication facilities.

Two given life term for killing minor girl

JHENIDAH, Aug 18: A father and his neighbour were awarded RI for life and penalized Taka 3000 in default to suffer in jail for another six months by Sakhawat Hossain Bahar Session Judge of Magura recently.

The case in brief. Saleha Khatun of village Parla in Magura thana informed police that her daughter Rozina, 8, was slaughtered in a nearby jungle on 27.5.95. Investigating police arrested Rozina's father Masud and Jahur Biswas. Police further arrested a young man from Kamalapur in Dhaka, Rabul Islam. In his statement Rabul confessed that he had killed the innocent girl. Rozina according to the advice of Jahur Biswas. Then Police submitted charsheet. After thorough hearing the Session Judge awarded life term to accused Jahur Biswas.

Wildlife in Cox's Bazar gradually decreasing

COX'S BAZAR, Aug 18: Wildlife, particularly mammals are gradually disappearing from Cox's Bazar forest region. Rampant poaching and unabated deforestation is threatening the existence of wild animals in Cox's Bazar and also causing imbalance in ecosystem in Chittagong hill districts.

It is learnt that 20 species of wild life have already disappeared and 45 other species are on the verge of extinction. Experts said, poaching, expansion of human settlements, industrialisation and extension of arable lands are the reasons behind the natural degradation.

According to forest officials, the 20 extinct species of animals include, nil gai, wild buffalo, wild cow, big horned deer, wolf and three types of rhinoceros. The species gradually disappeared mainly after the liberation of the country and were totally wiped out in the last ten years. Beside, the number of tigers, elephants, deers, monkeys, gharial and dolphin are also decreasing, they added.

The number of wild animals is decreasing every day in five of the seven thanas of Cox's Bazar due to various reasons for quite a long time. Teknaf, Ukhia, Ramu, Chakoria and Cox's Bazar sadar thanas of the district were once teeming with different types of wild animals, such as fox, jackal, wild cat and wolf. But these are now rarely found. These animals mainly live on rats and harmful insects and thus saved the crops.

But during the last three decades the number of wild animals have decreased in an alarming proportion. The population of the district has been increasing at an alarming rate. Every year new human settlements are established by clearing the jungles. Felling of trees for fire-wood have badly affected the habitat of wild animals.

According to experts, in

Bangladesh there are 105 species of mammals, 567 species of birds, 129 species of reptiles and 14 types of amphibians which constitute a rich wild-life resource.

Local people urged the concerned authorities to take proper steps to save the wild animals from further extinction to maintain a healthy environment.

At the same time, indiscriminate felling of fruit-bearing trees caused a serious threat to the ecology and fruit production of the Cox's Bazar district. Fruit-bearing trees in all the seven thanas of the district are on the verge of extinction, due to large-scale felling.

According to a source, Cox's Bazar sadar, Ramu, Ukhia, Kutubdia, Moheshkhali, Teknaf and Chakoria thanas of the district were once famous for abundant production of jackfruit, lichi, mango, palm, guava and pineapple. But now these trees are very few in number due to indiscriminate felling.

As the economic condition of the rural people in the district is rapidly deteriorating they are compelled to sell their fruit bearing trees to a section of traders.

Agricultural experts said,

the district situated in a region where fruit bearing trees grow with minimum care and cost. A huge quantity of surplus fruits were marketed by the growers.

Some farmers said, they

look loans from the money

lenders by mortgaging their

trees to meet their daily ex-

penses. They failed to refund

the loans and ultimately they

lost their trees after a few

years.

It may be mentioned that

there are 40 brickfields and 50 saw-mills in the district.


Hundreds of wood-loaded trucks are seen on their way to different areas of the country every day. On the other hand, planting of fruit-bearing trees is rare, causing ecological imbalance which is changing the rainfall and weather pattern of the district.
