A loss for the West Indies following their defeat by Australia earlier this year, would undeniably spell the end of their reign as world cricket's supreme force.

On the other hand, England have their greatest chance to win their first series against the Caribbean giants since 1969, and end a dismal six years in which their only series win has been against New Zealand.

The West Indians have acknowledged this is the biggest Test of any of their careers and to lose would be to go home in disgrace.

"In a way I think the pressure is on them." England captain Mike Atherton said. 'After being beaten' by Australia they don't want to lose two series in a row. In a sense, if we lose we will only be doing what every other England side has done against West Indies for 20
